A. W. Orr Presented his bond as Cemetary director with H. Bleakley security which on Motion was approved and accepted,

C. Davis Bond as assistant presented with J. W. Garrison as security which was approved.

An ordinance was presented directing D. Parker, to proceed to effect the annexation of contiguous territory to the Village,

On Motion The Rule requiring ordinances to be read at three Meetings before their final passage was suspended in order to take final action on the above Ordinance this evening.

The Ordinance was then taken up and passed as follows

On Motion The Mayor and Recorder were appointed as a Committee to levy a tax on the property of the Village for the present year.

On Motion An order was drawn on the Treasurer in favor of J. M. Garrison for \$10.00 for Painting, the same having been approved by the Financial Committee.

J. D. Parker presented a bill for services as solicitor for last amount \$50— which on Motion was referred to Financial Com.

On Motion The Contract for building side walks and Street Crossings for the present season, was awarded to George Skowp, said walks to be of white oak lumber. Plank 1 1/2 in. thick stringers 4 x 4 inches, ~~at~~ price 33 ct per foot, Street Crossings plank 2 in thick stringers 4 x 4 in, price 38 ct per foot.

On Motion An order was drawn on the Treasurer in favor of J. B. Miller for \$252.50 and interest to pay a Bond held by him.
