

said Village, rendering the cost and expence in front of each property abutting on each side walk separate, and said account shall give the number of the lots as platted and the names of the respective owners,

And at any time after the receipt of the same by the Council it may pass any and all necessary resolutions for the purpose of collecting the same and making it a charge on the property abutting on said side walks,

But if the cost of constructing or repairing said side walks will exceed the sum of Five Hundred dollars, the person or persons designated by the Council as aforesaid shall report the same to the Council for its further action as to giving notice and letting the work, and at any time after the report is received by said Council it shall have the right to give ^{necessary} notice for the letting of the work, and furnishing of the necessary materials and receive bids for doing of the work and award the doing of the work and furnishing necessary materials to the lowest bidder or bidders,

Sec 3 The Mayor of said Village is hereby required to keep in a Book to be provided for the purpose a Memorandum of the time and manner of serving notice on the owners of property abutting on side walks required to be constructed or repaired by resolution of the Council of said Village, and the person or persons employed by the Council shall at all reasonable times have the right to inspect the same for the purpose of enabling them to determine whether the owners of property abutting on side walks required by resolution of the Council to be constructed or repaired have done the same within the sixty days required by law,

Sec 4 This Ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and publication ^{as} required by law.

Council met pursuant to adjournment Mayor Laughlin in the Chair. Present A. W. Coates, Dennis Ely, J. C. Magan & Mr. Jones, the recorder being absent. On Motion Mr. Jones was appointed Recorder for the evening. Minutes of last Meeting read and approved. The Mayor presented his Monthly report, for the Month of May, showing that he had received for Amusement Licenses the sum of \$23.50 which was duly paid over to the Treas. which on Motion was accepted and approved.

Bills

The Bill presented at last Meeting by J. C. Cook and referred to Committee on Finance for investigation and correction for \$10.50 for boarding prisoners was corrected by deducting 10 cts. per Meal leaving amount due \$8.40 was ordered paid, and an order drawn on the Treasurer for the Amount.

On Motion An Order was drawn on the Treasurer in favor of George Stump for \$100.⁰⁰ to apply on contract for Street Croppings & side walks,

J. G. Hogue presented a bill for serving Notices &c which was accepted and an order drawn on the Treasurer for the Amount \$4.²⁵

On Motion of L. Ely, the resolution passed at a former Meeting granting an Order to Mr. Johnston for \$50.⁰⁰ to pay interest on Bond held by him, was reconsidered, he having received said interest money from the Cemetery Directors, and the order ~~cancelled~~ ^{rescinded}.

On Motion of L. Ely, the persons owning property on the east side of Freedom street, were ordered to be instructed to put down a side walk on said street ~~equal~~ in width of Paris plank laid upon three stringers 4 by 4 inches crosswise, any thing in the Ordinance passed May 16th 1870, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Resolutions

The following resolution was offered by A. W. Coates Resolved by the Town Council of Alliance, that there be ordered built forthwith a wall on the east side of Mt. Union street directly north of the P. H. W & C. Rail way bridge to protect the said street from being washed away by the water passing under said Bridge, the above resolution was passed by the following vote Yeas, Coates, Morgan Ely & Jones, 4 nays none.

The question of taking up the four foot side walk on the west side of Arch street was referred to the Committee on side walks.

On Motion of L. Ely, a levy of five Mills on the Dollar on the taxable property within the Corporation was made and the Mayor was instructed to forward the same to the County Auditor to be placed upon the Tax Duplicate for Corporation purposes.

On Motion The Mayor was instructed to see the Officers of the Gas Co and ascertain what would be the cost of keeping one of the lamps on Main street near the Rail Road burning all night.

On Motion of J. C. Morgan, the Mayor was instructed to appoint a committee of three to investigate the matter of a public Fountain or watering place, thereupon, J. C. Morgan, L. Ely, & A. W. Coates
