On motion of Gray seconded by Vincent the case of certain parties residing on North side of West Main Street in regard to grade was referred to Sidewalk Committee for examination and report.

1.) Alliance Co July 2 1877

To the Hon Council

Sirs: I will do the work of laying sidewalk for \$1.50 per day. or will lay the walks for 3 cts per foot the city furnish material.

2.) Alliance Co June 30. 1877

To the Side Walk Committee Gentlemen

I will furnish good material and put in crossings 4 feet wide at 25 cents per foot running mashes and side ones in proportion and side walks 6 feet wide at 25 cents per foot running mashes or will do the work the same as I am doing at 1.50 Per Day.

3.) To the Town Council of Alliance
 June 18, 1877
 Cropping six feet wide at twenty nine
 cents per foot running across, sidewalk six
 feet wide twenty two cents per foot and all
 other widths in the same proportion.

Crossing where material is furnished for
 six feet wide five cents per foot, sidewalk
 two and a half cts per foot and will do
 the work for the town at two dollars per day
 J. Shidler.

4.) To the Honorable Council of the Incorporated
 Village of Alliance Ohio.

In response to your proposition to receive
 bids for the furnishing of the material for ^{and}
 performing the labor in building the sidewalks
 within said Village, that may have to be laid
 by said Village with wood, I hereby promise
 to furnish all the oak stringers 4x4 Inch lay
 them four feet apart, furnish the plank pine
 1 1/2 in. thick and furnish cuttles nails and
 perform the labor other than the grading for
 the sum of 23 cents per foot to the town
 furnish all material and I will perform
 the labor for the sum of two and seven eighths
 cents per foot or will work for one dollar and
 sixty cts per day.
