Minutes of last Meeting read and approved.

Report

The Committee to whom was referred the matter of a water course on North Liberty street Reported in favor of a sewer on the east side of said street made of tile capacity 24 inches. Report received.

On Motion

J. C. Morgan was appointed a Committee, to visit the tile Manufacturers and purchase tile for the above mentioned sewer on the best terms possible.

Petition

A Petition signed by O. J. Newcastle & C. E. Gyles, was presented praying that a side walk be ordered down on the west side of Freedom street commencing at the south side of Market at the Baptist Church and running thence south to Broad street.

On Motion

The following resolution was passed by a unanimous vote of the Members present.

Resolved that a side walk be ordered put down on the west side of Freedom street commencing at the south side of Market street and running thence south to Broad street, said walk to be six feet in width and of the usual material.

Bill

Jason W. Webb presented a Bill for laying Riprap drain on the south side of Main street west of the Bridge, which on Motion was referred to the Committee on streets & Alleys.

John Speck presented a Bill for stone furnished and laying Riprap drain on Main street near the Post Office.

Council Met pursuant to adjournment Mayor Laughlin in the Chair. Present, J. Clapsaddle, St. Altman, Mr. Jones & J. C. Morgan.

Minutes of last Meeting read and approved.

J. C. Morgan who was appointed to ascertain the price at which drain tile could be purchased for sewer on North Liberty street. Reported that he had visited the Factory of J. J. Richie & Co and that they proposed to furnish 18 inch tile at 43 3/4 cents per foot free

Freight, report received and On Motion said Morgan was continued as a Committee to purchase a sufficient quantity to make the sewer on said North Liberty street at the price proposed by said Richin & Co to wit 43 3/4¢ per foot the resolution passed at last Meeting was resumed, and a double pipe of 18 inches diameter substituted instead of one 24 inch pipe as provided by said resolution, for said sewer of Liberty street.

On Motion

Bills

P. B. Garland presented a bill for street Croppings, Trunks, Bridges and sidewalks, which On Motion was referred to the Committee on sidewalks and streets & Alleys, to report at next Meeting
B. F. Foltz presented a Bill for smithwork which on Motion was accepted and an Order drawn on the Treasurer for the Amount \$45.00

Pop Rice presented a Bill for laying 7 1/4 per cent of stone wall on Mt. Union street near R. B. Cropping, which on Motion was accepted and an order drawn on the Treasurer for the Amount \$266.03

J. B. Morgan presented a Bill for his time and Expenses in going to Tile Manufactory, which On Motion was accepted and an Order drawn on the Treasury for the Amount \$8.00

On Motion an Order was drawn on the Treasury in favor of P. B. Garland for \$32.00 to apply on street Croppings &c

E. Tetter presented a Bill for damages sustained by reason of the breaking of Glass in the Opera House by a person under arrest while in the presence of the Officer, which on Motion was referred to the Village solicitor,

Resolution

A resolution was presented as follows:

Resolved that the Town of Alliance will appropriate the sum of Forty Dollars \$40.00 towards a well of water 6 feet in diameter curbed & covered, properly walled, with a good pump in the same, at the intersection of Arch & Main streets in the North west corner of said intersection, which sum the town will pay on completion of the said well, to the parties who ~~are~~ it done and on condition that a good well of water is obtained

On Motion adjourned to Meet on next Monday evening August 25th 1870. at 7 o'clock.
