

Allice August 15th 1840

Council Met pursuant to adjournment, Mayor Laughlin
presiding, Members present, St. Aultman, A. W. Coates,
S. Clapsaddle, and J. C. Magaw,

Minutes of last Meeting read and approved.

The Committee on Streets & Committee on side walks to whom
was referred the accounts of P. B. Garland reported that
they had examined said accounts and find a
balance due him of \$662.32 thereupon on Motion
the Report was accepted and an order drawn of
the Treasurer for the amount due.

Bills

The Committee to whom was referred the account of
J. W. Webb report the same to be correct report
received and an Order drawn on the Treasurer
for the amount found due \$77.25

Committee to whom was referred the Bills of John
Specter report that they have examined said Bill
and find it correct, report received and an order
drawn on the Treasury for the amount \$53.50

Strong & Lovell, presented a Bill for draw style which
was accepted and an order drawn of the Treasury
for the amount \$14.25

St. Laughlin presented a Bill for Making and Stamping
Cemetery deeds which was accepted and an Order drawn
on the Treasurer for the amount \$6.00

On Motion of S. Clapsaddle an Order was drawn on the
Treasurer in favor of Widow Fisher for \$20.00 who was
injured by reason of a defective side walk in front
of property of Amos Burden within the Village.

On Motion The Street Commissioner was instructed to proceed to
collect by law if necessary the penalty provided
by law against persons refusing or neglecting to
perform two days labor on the public highways
or paying the amount ~~provided~~ in lieu thereof
as provided by law.

An Ordinance was presented by the Solicitor, to
prevent dogs from running at large except when
securely muzzled.

On Motion The rule requiring all Ordinances to be read at
three Meetings before their final passage was
suspended in Order to pass the above Ordinance
this evening.

The Ordinance was then taken up and passed
as follows: Ayes Coates, Clapsaddle, Aultman and

Morgan, 4 days none

Adjourned to Meet on the first Monday evening in September at 7 o'clock.

An Ordinance to prevent the running at large of Dogs within the Village of Alliance.

Be it Ordained and enacted by the Council of said Village that it shall be unlawful for any dog to run at large in said town unless the same is safely and securely muzzled.

Sec¹ That the Marshal of said town is hereby required to kill any dog at large contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance. The Marshal shall receive from the town for killing and burying each dog the sum of Fifty cents

Sec² That any person may kill such dog as may be found at large in said town contrary to this Ordinance, this Ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.
