Council Met pursuant to adjournment Mayor in the Chair  
Present H. Altman, A. W. Coates, J. Clapsaddle, W. Jones  
and J. C. Morgan,

Minutes

of last Meeting read and approved.

Petition

The Mayor presented his Monthly report, showing that  
he had received during the past month for Licence  
& fines the sum of \$8<sup>50</sup> dollars and paid the to Treasurer.  
Presented signed by Isaac Humphreys and 3 others  
asking that a sidewalk be ordered on the east side  
of Station street from Broad street south to

referred to Committee on side walks.

On Motion of J. C. Morgan, A Resolution was passed as follows:

Resolved, that no side walks shall be ordered laid by this Council  
except by Petitions signed by a Majority of the residents  
residing on the street where such side walk may be  
asked.

On Motion

Strong & Lower, were instructed to unload and deliver  
on the street where needed the tile purchased for the  
sewer on north Liberty, and to receive a reasonable  
compensation for their services.

Report

J. C. Morgan, who was appointed a Committee at a former  
Meeting to purchase tile for sewer on north Liberty  
street. Reported that he had ordered 1208 feet of sewer  
pipe from J. J. Richie & Co of Salmadge Summit Co Ohio  
for sewer on north Liberty street.

Report received and Committee discharged.

On Motion

It was unanimously agreed by the Council to allow the  
Mayor \$100.<sup>00</sup> Rent for the Mayors office & Council Chamber  
the present year, the Mayor agreeing to furnish light and  
fuel for the same.

Bills

H. K. Brown presented a Bill for Printing Amount \$13.25  
which On Motion was accepted and an order drawn on  
the Treasurer for the Amount.

P. B. Garland presented a Bill for Shunks & Bridges which  
On Motion was accepted and an order drawn on the  
Treasurer for the Amount \$124.71

P. B. Garland also presented a Bill for side walks referred to  
Committee on side walks.

Petition

presented asking that the sidewalk ordered on the west side  
of Mt Union street be reduced in width to 6 feet, and that the  
said walks be laid with either Oak or Pine Lumber as  
may best suit the parties who have the said walk to make  
referred to Committee on side walks.
