

April 10th 1871

Council at the call of the Mayor. Members present, J. C. Morgan, A. St. Coates, J. Clapsaddle, Henry Altman, & St. Jones. Minutes of last Meeting read and approved.

The solicitor submitted a contract between the Village and C. E. Gray, as to furnishing Gas for street lamps, lighting extinguishing, and keeping the same in order for the year 1871, which was approved and on Motion of A. St. Coates the Mayor and Recorder were authorized to sign said Contract. The Mayor submitted his report for the Month ending April 10/71 showing that he had received and paid into the Treasury since the 6th day of March the sum of \$10.⁵² For Licenses Granted.

Bills

The following Bills were presented and accepted and drawn on the Treasury for their respective amounts.

J. C. Morgan, on behalf of the Committee, appointed to Petition the General Assembly asking that they pass an act enabling the Village to issue Bonds and Borrow Money, reported that the committee were not prepared to make a full report Committee continued.

Resolutions

A. St. Coates, offered the following resolution which was passed.

Resolved that each lot owner or owners on the south side of Alliance street from the west line of the brick building of West Gillespie, to the east side of Mt. Union street, be and are hereby required to lay down a side walk in front of the lot of each owner respectively, to be eight feet in width, of Pine plank laid lengthwise 1 1/2 inches thick on stringers as required by Ordinance passed May 16th 1870. Provided each lot owner may lay a walk of the same width of Brick or Flag stone, well laid in place of the pine, and that proper steps be taken to enforce this resolution.

St. Jones, offered the following resolution, which was passed by a Unanimous Vote

Resolved that the Council as a body feel highly gratified at the result of the recent election in regard to the question shall intoxicating Liquors be sold by the drink, and we hereby tender our thanks to the Citizens who voted no the above question.
