On motion of Gray seconded by Beardley  
 Report was accepted & ordered filed.

Statement of P. B. Garland of Lumber  
 Spikes and Fool Account was read &  
 on motion of Coates seconded by Beardley  
 received & ordered filed.

Gray presented the following:

Resolved that the Committee on  
 Sidewalks & Crossings report at the first  
 regular meeting of each month the number  
 of crossings put down & where, state amount  
 of lumber & spikes in each, also report  
 the number of feet of Sidewalks put down in front  
 of each lot, giving the number of lot & the address  
 to which it belongs, the owners name, give the  
 amount of each kind of material used; also  
 report the length of time engaged at each place

On motion Beardaley seconded by Coates the Resolution was adopted.

Petition of Mr Lydia Jenkins asking consent of the County Commissioners to detach their farm from Alliance Incorporation, on account of heavy taxation, and their legal inability to sell the farm, was read and on motion of Lincoln seconded by Gray referred to Solicitor.

Moved by Coates that new Sidewalks be ordered on North Side of Patterson Street from Mahoning Street east to Lot of J. B. Johnson, except in front of lots of Ely Phillips, & C Phillips, which walks to be repaired, new walks on east side of North Liberty Street in front of lots of P. King, S. Coffey, S. Huser, Jas McMichael Thos Bevington & Priscilla Buck, also east side of Nott Street from Patterson to Isaac S. Nott's residence, also east side of Second Street from east Corner of John Davis Lot to Mahoning Street, also North Side of <sup>Second Street from</sup> Mahoning Street to Nott Street, also east side of Mahoning Street from Patterson to Green Street and the walks to be repaired on North Side of Patterson Street from Mahoning Street to North Liberty Street. motion was seconded by Lusk, when Beardaley moved that the matter be laid on the table for further consideration seconded by Lusk & carried.

On motion of Gray seconded by Coates the Bills were accepted & ordered paid.

H. Vincent presented the following Resolutions moved to be adopted viz:

"Resolved that in order to encourage the permanent improvement of Alliance Street or any part thereof by paving with stone agreeable to Plans & specifications accepted by the Council or Street Committee, that this Council do agree to aid the same by completing the improvement of the Streets & alleys within the limits of such improvement. Motion seconded by Coates & carried.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Gray the Fire Dept Committee were instructed to procure the necessary equipments for the Fire Police.

On motion of Gray seconded by Beardsley passed to 1<sup>st</sup> Reading an Ordinance to regulate the Cemetery & the Cemetery Trustees.

The Solicitor made a verbal Report in the matter of the Jenkins farm stating that the Council had the authority to recommend to the Commissioners the striking

from the Incorporation the said farms, if they thought best, he also stated that the necessary steps ought to be taken to declare as nuisances the properties of Crowther and Hallow, unless they were repaired, and that proper notification ought to be given to the parties.

On motion of Vincent seconded by Conter the matter of the Jenkins farm was referred to a special Committee of Three for investigation & Report. The Mayor appointed as said Committee: Vincent Leek & Gray.

On motion of Gray seconded by Vincent the Mayor was requested to send proper notices to Mr. W. W. Hallow & to Mr. Thos Crowther to have their buildings repaired or removed within thirty days, or the town would have the same done at their expense to be taxed against the property on the duplicate.

The following Resolution was read:

Whereas certain Citizens of Alliance petitioned your Honorable Body to improve Sec. St. Liberty Street representing it was impassable and said Petition was referred to the Committee on Streets & Alleys, who upon examination reported favorable on said petition and Whereas certain Citizens of Alliance and vicinity subscribed sums of money aggregating two hundred dollars or upwards as a gratis fund to assist in said improvements

Therefore resolved that we adopt the report of our committee & that we will aid & encourage the above named improvements.

On motion of Gray seconded by Recordale the Resolution was adopted.
