On Motion a Committee consisting of R. C. Greenlee and M. C. Pennock were appointed to procure the necessary equipments & fixtures for Hook & Ladder & Bucket fire Company now organized.

On Motion J. C. Morgan and J. C. Sullen were appointed a committee to have the Fire Engine repaired so as to make it efficient in case of fire.

Petition presented signed by J. A. Kingsbury, A. S. Hollabaugh, Wm. Cather L. D., Klein G. B. Coats & others asking that a bridge be erected across the stream where it crosses the Alley near the south end of A. S. Hollabaugh's property in Milnes 1st. addition to Alliance, which on motion of A. W. Coats was received and referred to the Committee on Streets & Alleys.

St Committee The Committee on Streets & Alleys made a report as follows
The your Committee on street would beg leave to report that a stream of water has been turned from its original channel and caused to run for nearly two hundred feet along Webb street to the great damage of said street, would recommend that the Council take such action as they deem best to have the channel of said stream so changed as to prevent further damage to said street, signed J. C. Morgan, R. C. Greenlee.

On Motion of A. W. Coats the report received and the matter referred back to the Committee with instructions to endeavor to have the evil remedied if possible. The Mayor nominated Dr. M. Candlap as a member of the board of health in the place of Dr. Wilson who declined to serve, the nomination accepted and Dr. M. Candlap was duly appointed as a member of the board of health for the present year.

On Motion J. C. Morgan and M. C. Pennock were appointed a committee to purchase pipe to conduct the water from the College well to the public square.

Bill P. B. Garland presented Bill for street crossings and sidewalks upon which there was unpaid 68.63 and also a Bill for trunks 50.09 \$ 118.72 which were accepted and an order drawn on the Treasurer for the amount.

On Motion adjourned to meet on first Monday of next month at 7 o'clock P. M.
