Minutes  
A. Petition

Council Met pursuant to adjournment Mayor Laughlin in the Chair, & Members all present of last Meeting read Corrected and approved, was presented signed by several hundred Citizens of the Village praying that the Ordinance now pending before the Council for the suppression of Ale Beer and Porter Houses within the Village, be not passed, which on Motion was received and referred to a Committee Consisting of A. H. Coats and J. C. Morgan with power to send for persons and papers ~~with~~ instructions to report at a Meeting to be held on next Monday Evening in Concert Hall, at which time said Ordinance will be taken up for final action.

Report

The Committee to whom was referred the Matter of procuring pipes and conducting the water from the College Well to the public square, reported that they did not think it advisable to put water pipes in said well without the authority of the Parties who might have the right to demand the removal of said water pipes at any time they might ~~be~~ proper to do so, and that in view of these considerations they had done nothing and asked to be discharged.

on Motion

Report received and Committee discharged.

Bills

The persons employed as night Policemen presented their Bills for said service which were referred to the Finance Committee with instructions to settle the same and report at next Meeting.

Petition

was presented signed by Sharr & Son & R. H. Seeter, who each agree to pay \$25.<sup>00</sup> towards sinking a well on Fifth street between the Opera House and the shop of Sharr & Son, and asking an appropriation from the town Treasury for said object. Thereupon on Motion of J. C. Morgan, the sum of \$50.<sup>00</sup> dollars was appropriated for said purpose on condition that said well should not be less than six feet in diameter inside of the wall, and the same shall <sup>be</sup> sunk to a depth to satisfy the Council that it will afford a sufficient quantity of water.

Petition

was presented praying that Ellits Meat Shop and sutons fence and other obstructions now on Liberty street between the property known as the Crew property and the property of said J. C. Butler on said Liberty street

be removed, which on Motion was received and referred to the Committee on streets & Alleys, to report at next regular Meeting

Report

The Committee on streets & Alleys in relation to the Bridge asked for on the Alley south of the property of Hollebaugh & Kingsbury and others reported as follows:

We your Committee on streets & Alleys would beg leave to report, that owing to the scarcity of Money we would recommend that action in reference to improvement on the alley south of Hollebaugh & Kingsberrys property be deferred for the present, Report received and referred back to Committee

Ordinance

An Ordinance providing for the punishment of vagrants was presented, which on Motion was received and passed to its first reading,

of M. C. Pennock an order was drawn on the Treasurer in favor of H. H. Sell for \$25.00 to apply on Fees as Treasurer,

R. C. Greenlee offered the following Resolution which was received and on Motion adopted,

Resolved that the solicitor be instructed to draft an Ordinance and present at the next Regular Meeting of the Council, to prohibit the building of business houses on Main street of wood or other inflammable Material, and providing that all persons proposing to build business houses on said street be required to submit the plans of building to the Council for their approval before commencing the erection of any such building,

J. C. Morgan Made a Motion that an order be drawn on the Treasury for \$20.00 in favor of the street Commission as a loan to be paid back by him as soon as he could collect the Money from persons who propose to pay \$3. each in lieu of work on the streets as required by Law which was negatived by the Not agreed to

R. C. Greenlee offered a resolution as follows:

Resolved that a committee of three be appointed to Dig a well if need be near the College and conduct the water from the same to the Public Square
