

Mayor Laughlin called attention of Council to a sewer trunk near the Pottery which being too high causes the water to accumulate above it, referred to Committee on streets & alleys.

The Ordinance for the suppression of Ale Beer and Porter houses, and places of resort for habitual tippling, having passed its third reading at last Meeting, and laid over for final action at this, was then taken up and discussed by each Member of Council in turn, after which the vote was taken by calling the yeas and nays which resulted as follows: Yeas J. C. Morgan, A. H. Coates, H. Altman and W. C. Pennock 4 Nays Linus Ely and R. C. Greenlee 2 upon which the Mayor pronounced the Ordinance passed.

On Motion of J. C. Morgan, the Ordinance was ordered to be published in the Town papers as required by law

On Motion of L. Ely, the special Police force was ordered disbanded.

On Motion Adjourned to Meet on the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday evening in July next.

Council met pursuant to adjournment, Mayor Laughlin in the chair, Members of Council all present, Minutes of last Meeting read and approved.

Report J. C. Morgan on behalf of Committee to locate and cause to be dug a Public Well or wells on Broadway reported that they had contracted with parties to sink a well at the junction of Depot & Broadway streets, and at this time said well has been sunk to the depth of about 24 feet with a fair prospect of water.

Report The Mayor presented his Financial report for the Month of May (omitted last Month) which showed that he had received from fines Licenses &c. and paid over to the Treasurer the sum of \$32.75, which on Motion was accepted and approved.

The Mayor also presented his report of receipts for the Month of June setting forth that he had received during said Month from fines & licenses the sum of \$7.<sup>00</sup> which had been duly paid over to the Treasurer

On Motion report accepted and approved.

On Motion of J. C. Morgan the Ordinance for the punishment of

Vagrancy now pending was taken up and passed its third reading after being amended so as to better provide for the punishment of persons who might be convicted under it, and its various bearings discussed by the solicitor, G. Ely, J. C. Morgan and A. H. Coates. On motion it was put upon its final passage the yeas and nays being called resulted as follows: viz

Yeas G. Ely, J. C. Morgan, W. Altman, R. C. Greenlee and A. H. Coates 5 Nays None.

Mayor Laughlin thereupon declared the Ordinance duly passed.

On Motion of J. C. Morgan the above ordinance was ordered to be printed in both the newspapers of the Village

Petition A Petition was presented from citizens residing on Park street, asking for the widening and improving of said street between Alliance street and the Pittsburgh Fort Wayne & Chicago Rail Way that part being ten feet less in width than the balance of said street.
