Council Met pursuant to adjournment. Mayor Laughlin in the Chair, Members present G. Ely, R. C. Greenlee, J. B. Morgan and W. C. Pennock. The Minutes of last regular and intervening special Meetings read and approved.

The Committee to whom was referred the Petition for a regular Police force asked further time to report which was granted. The Mayor presented his financial report for the Month of July, showing that he had received and paid over to the Treasurer during the Month for Fines & Licenses the sum of \$20.<sup>00</sup> Our Motion report received and approved.

Mayors Bill

Mayor Laughlin presented a Bill for one quarter rent for Office to July 1<sup>st</sup> \$25.<sup>00</sup> and one quarter salary to same date \$25.<sup>00</sup> in all \$50.<sup>00</sup> which on Motion was accepted and an order drawn on the Treasurer for the amount

Committee on streets & Alleys, Reported amount due on Bill of P. B. Garland for repairing Bridges and making Turns to be \$98.38, also another Bill for further work of the same kind including work and material for Public Well curbing to amount of \$68.47 both bills having been approved by the Street Commissioner, and being in full for that class of work up to date, which on Motion were accepted and an order drawn on the Treasurer for their amount \$166.85

of the Petitioners, The Solicitor having given his opinion that said part of Liberty street having been properly laid out and dedicated as a street and is still to all intents and purposes a public street to be used as such when required, report of committee accepted and matter laid over ~~until~~ <sup>to next</sup> meeting. The Committee on Hook & Ladder, apparatus reported Progress but no final action taken, they had offers from Philadelphia for outfit not including ladders for \$600. - From Ravenna at the same price, and had examined one in Montreal Canada which for Wagon and small hooks not including ladders, was offered at \$210. - subject to further expense of Exchange on Money, duty and Cost of Transportation, Committee continued and increased by addition of J. C. Morgan.

Petition

A petition signed by citizens on Main street was presented asking that the walk on the north side of said street be put to the Grade and in repair which on Motion was received and referred to the Committee on side Walks.

St. Commis. Finance

submitted a statement of amt of labor performed and Money received to date as follows:

Mr. Ely suggested the propriety of having the Census of the Village taken in view of the contemplated advancement of the Village to a City of the second Class, and asked if it would not be advisable to employ J. A. Kingsbury to do it in connection with his labor in taking the enumeration of the Youth for school purposes, as he had offered to do it at a much less rate than it could be done alone, thereupon on Motion the Council agreed to employ Mr. Kingsbury at a stipulated price and instructed the Solicitor to give him the necessary instructions for doing the same in a proper manner.

Ordinances

The following Ordinances, were introduced and passed to their first reading: to wit:

- An Ordinance to more fully preserve the Peace and quiet of the Village.
- An Ordinance to regulate the erection of Building and other structures within certain portions of the corporate limits, and an Ordinance to prevent Professional Begging on the streets or from house to house.
