Mr Pennock offered a Motion to allow the Marshal ten cents each for serving notices on persons to hang their gates & doors so as to swing from instead of over the sidewalks,

Mr Greenlee offered an Amendment making the amount twenty five instead of ten cents, amendment accepted by the Mover and being seconded and a vote taken was duly passed,

The Committee to whom was referred the Matter of Employing a suitable person to examine Chimneys flues and stove pipes in use within the Village with reference to their safety, reported that they had Employed J. N. Ramsey at \$3. per day, report accepted and Committee discharged
of Mr Pennock the piece of land proposed to be donated by Mr. George Robinson ^{to the Village} for street purposes at the Bridge near the sawmill of Mr Bobuck, was accepted, and the Solicitor instructed to have the proper Record of the same placed upon the County Records
