On Motion H. Altman was appointed a committee to receive from the Trustees of the Township any money that they may appropriate towards defraying the expense of digging the Public well on the square, and pay the same over to the Treasurer of the Village.

Kent and others asking that a sidewalk on the south side of south street, and also that a lot of stones lying on the corner of said south and liberty streets be removed. which on Motion was received and referred to the Committee on side walks.

Petition A Petition was presented signed by A. G. Jones, Mr. Keeley, C. P. Coffey, Emory Ostrom and 6 others asking that a sidewalk be ordered on the south side of Ely street, from Mt. Union street west to the west line of property owned and occupied by Saml. Ray, which on Motion was received and referred to the Committee on side walks

On Motion of J. B. Morgan, A. H. Coates and the solicitors were appointed a Committee to take the proper measures to have ~~the~~ at street opened from Ely street to the west line of property owned by L. Ely, and running thence due north to the Cemetery.

On Motion The Mayor & Recorder was instructed to draw all orders payable at sight, ~~to bear~~ interest at the rate of 6 per cent after presentation until paid

Michael Condon presented a bill for digging trenches for water pipe and helping to lay the same amount \$56.00 which on Motion was received and referred to the Committee to bring water from public well to a Cistern on Public square The Ordinance to prevent obstructions on side walks was taken

Ordinances Papered 2^d reading up and passed to its second reading, and referred to Mr Pennock ^{the solicitor for amendment} The Ordinance to provide for the protection of Apprentices in pavements was taken up and passed to its 2^d reading

Mr Morgan Made a Motion to strike sections 2 & 5 from the above ordinance, which was laid over until next Meeting.

On Motion of Mr Greenlee, the solicitor was instructed to draft an ordinance to require persons owning or occupying Lots within the Village to remove the snow from the side walk abutting on the same by 10 o'clock A.M. of each day, under a penalty of 50 cents for the 1st offence and \$1.00 for every subsequent offence at the discretion of the Mayor,

On Motion adjourned to Meet on the 1st Monday Evening in July 1872 at 6 1/2 o'clock.
