Committee Report

Mr Pennock on behalf of the Committee appointed to contract with St. Valentine for Gas for street lamps, reported that they had not completed a contract, and asked further time which was granted, with leave to report at next Meeting.

Mr Pennock on behalf of the Committee on side walks in the Matter of a walk on Ely street & south street asked further time which was granted.

Proposition

Messrs Thomas and Charles Dexter submitted a proposition to grant the right of way for a street through lands owned by them, beginning at Mt. Union street and running due west to a point 150 feet east of John Cairys land, and running thence due north to Cemetery street, on condition that the town will put a good fence on each side of said street and also make a side walk on one side of said street, which on motion was received and referred to the Committee in the Matter of opening a new street to the Cemetery.

On Motion the Mayor & Recorder were ordered to remove Bonds held by Wm Guerin & R. Sugels, at 8% interest
