The vote was now taken on the motion as amended. vote
ayes, Linwood, Ernst, Barnaby, Crubaugh, & Bard.
C. Barnaby agreed to see to having Peppitt prepare all
the ~~proposed~~ Ordinances.

Ernst moved to adjourn, to meet again on Thursday evening
next.

Mt Union Stark Co Ohio July 10th 1878
Council met pursuant to adjournment. 7 members
present Mayor Crubaugh, Councilmen, Barnaby,
Borem, Bard, Ernst, and Linwood. The Clerk being absent
it was moved by Ernst, and seconded by Borem that Charles
Barnaby act as clerk pro tem. Motion carried.
Bill of A. P. Vaughn amounting to (\$3.15) Three Dollars and
fifteen cents for lighting Street Lamps Twenty One (21) nights, was
presented, and on motion of Ernst seconded by Bard was ordered
paid, if any money in the treasury applicable therefor. Vote
ayes Barnaby - Borem, Bard, Linwood and Ernst.
The Clerk read an ordinance empowering the Mayor and Clerk
to give a Bond of the Village, in the amount of One hundred
Dollars (\$100.00) to pay the cost of Street Croppings. (time fifteen
months). At this time Nestley Crubaugh came in.
Mr Bard moved that the rules be so suspended as to allow
the Ordinance to pass to its second and third reading, and
final passage. Seconded by Ernst. Vote ayes, Borem,
Linwood, Barnaby, Ernst, Bard & Crubaugh.
On motion of Ernst - seconded by Borem it was voted that

Ordinance be read the second time. Vote ayes, Barnaby, Linwood, Ernst, Crubaugh, Bard, Borem. It was moved by Crubaugh, & seconded by Borem that the Ordinance be placed upon its third and final reading. Vote Ayes Barnaby, Linwood, Ernst, Crubaugh, Bard & Borem. On Motion of Linwood seconded by Crubaugh that the Ordinance be passed and that the Clerk see that the same is published. resulted as follows viz: Ayes, Barnaby, Bard, Borem, Linwood, Ernst & Crubaugh. The Mayor declared the Ordinance duly passed.

An Ordinance was now read, entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Section Three (3) of an Ordinance, entitled an Ordinance to provide for constructing side walks, within the Borough of Mount Union Ohio, passed October 2nd 1871. It was moved by Ernst and seconded by Borem that the Rules be so suspended as to allow the Ordinance just read, to be passed to its 2nd and 3rd Reading and final passage, vote Ayes, Bard, Barnaby, Borem, Crubaugh, Ernst, & Linwood.

It was moved by Bard and seconded by Crubaugh that the Ordinance be placed upon its 2nd reading. Vote ayes Linwood, Ernst, Bard, Borem, Barnaby, & Crubaugh.

It was moved by Ernst and seconded by Bard, that the Ordinance of amendment be passed to its third reading. Vote Ayes, Bard, Borem, Ernst, Crubaugh, Linwood & Barnaby.

It was moved by Crubaugh & seconded Borem that the Ordinance be put upon its final passage, Vote Ayes, Linwood, Ernst, Borem, Bard, Barnaby & Crubaugh.

The Mayor declared the Ordinance passed

The Clerk read an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to prevent Fast Driving and otherwise regulate the use of Domestic animals"

It was moved by Borem seconded by Crubaugh that the Rules be suspended so as to allow the Ordinance relating to Fast Driving &c to be passed to the second and third reading and final passage. Vote Ayes, Barnaby - Bard, Borem Ernst Senwood, & Crubaugh.

On motion of Senwood seconded by Ernst the Ordinance was read the 2nd time, all voting ayes - On motion of Bard seconded by Senwood the ordinance was placed upon the 3rd reading & final reading. Vote on motion favoring it. Ayes Bard, Borem, Barnaby Senwood, Ernst & Crubaugh. Nays none.

Senwood moved that the ordinance be finally passed seconded by Crubaugh - Vote Ayes, Borem, Barnaby Bard, Ernst, Crubaugh & Senwood.

The Mayor declared the Ordinance duly passed, The Clerk was directed to have the Ordinances published.

It was moved by Crubaugh and seconded by Borem that hereafter all street crossings constructed, shall be of stone, put down under instruction of the Council, Vote Ayes Crubaugh & Borem. Nays Bard, Senwood & Barnaby. Motion lost, (Councilmen J.G. Ernst had retired before this vote was taken.)

On motion of Bard seconded by Borem, C. Barnaby & Senwood were appointed a Committee to examine and repair the Town Pump and Well, and put the same in good condition, by repairing Curb & St properly & draining off waste water. Vote Ayes, Bard, Borem, Barnaby, Crubaugh & Senwood.

On motion Council adjourned
