

Special meeting of the Council held Sept 17th 1878
 members present. Clarkson Barnaby, W. W. Crubaugh
 John Borem and John G. Ernst, Mayor
 Crubaugh presiding. The proceedings of last meeting
 read and on motion of In^o Borem, seconded by
 W. W. Crubaugh, were approved and accepted.

C. Barnaby on behalf of the Comm. appointed to repair
 town Pump, reported, that a new Pump had been put
 in, and a new covering on the curb of the well, and
 asked for a continuation of the Committee with
 instructions to Rip - Rap with Coble stones, around the
 well so as to prevent its becoming muddy, and also
 to have the Well cleaned, when it can be done.

Ernst moved to receive the report of the Committee
 and that they be continued as per request, seconded
 by John Borem, and motion prevailed as follows
