Honorable Council of Alliance.

In consideration of the various complaints laid before you last Monday night against Policeman M. H. Lownman

The undersigned members of the Police Committee beg leave to make the following Report of their investigations in regard to the facts in the case:

The duties devolving upon us in this examination was to say the least unpleasant and disagreeable and after a thorough examination into the facts in the case we do find the said Lownman guilty in this that,

- 1, on the nights of the 28-29-30 of July 1877 the said Lownman was so much under the influence of intoxicating drinks as to render him unfit for Police duty and in consequence of said drink did neglect his said duties.

- 2, By indiscreetly frequenting the City Prison on the night of July 29th and holding conversation with a female prisoner and allowing the lights to be turned down to the scandal and disgrace of the Police force.

3^d Unofficially entering and remaining in a caboon away from his boat between the hours of 11th & 1st clock at night July 29. and again on Saturday night Aug 11 was under the influence of liquor.
