

Regular meeting of Council held at Mayor's Office Nov 11<sup>th</sup> 1878  
 Members present Messrs John G. Ernst, John W Borem, Henry Linwood  
 and Clarkson Barnaby, Mayor Wm B. Cornbaugh presiding;  
 Proceedings of last session read and approved. The following Bills  
 were presented, A Bill for Book by Rice for use of Board of Health  
 costing fifty cents (50<sup>cs</sup>)

For cash advanced by W. P. Rice for purchase of Lumber to Glasgow \$8.<sup>96</sup>

For cash advanced by C. Barnaby for purchasing lumber of Glasgow 7.<sup>29</sup>

To Mill Conrad for lighting St Lamps 17 nights @ 15<sup>cs</sup> brought 2.<sup>55</sup>

Mr Ernst moved the bills be accepted and paid from the  
 proper funds - seconded by C. Barnaby - vote ayes Linwood  
 Borem, Barnaby and Ernst, nays none.

A bill was presented for Police service on night of 31<sup>st</sup> of  
 October, as follows, Henry Grimes - \$12.<sup>50</sup>

Service by the 2 Loman Bros. of alliance 3.<sup>00</sup>

Mr Ernst moved that the bills be paid from Police Fund  
 Mr Borem seconded the motion, vote ayes Linwood  
 Barnaby, Borem & Ernst.

A Communication from the Board of Health was read,  
 stating the action that had been taken by the Bd of Health in  
 regard to draining & cleaning the Mill pond - said document  
 reading as follows. - viz:

"At a meeting of the Board of Health  
 of Mount Union held Nov 5<sup>th</sup> 1878, E. N. Karlshorn offered the following  
 motion, That the instruction given the Clerk at the last meeting  
 of the Board, to notify the owners of the Mill Pond to drain and  
 clean the same, be postponed indefinitely in order to give an  
 opportunity to drain and clean said Pond quietly and peaceably  
 by voluntary contributions or otherwise, seconded by C. Bard  
 members voting, Karlshorn yes, Bard yes, Steffy yes, Rakestraw yes  
 Griffith yes, A motion prevailed that E. N. Karlshorn, E. N. Johnson  
 & Wm Aubrey be designated to manage the whole matter of promptly  
 and properly draining and cleaning the Mill Pond.

Mr Steffy moved that the Board ask the Council to ratify  
 the action of the Board in this matter. Motion prevailed."

After fully discussing the action of Bd of Health as above set forth  
 it was moved by C. Barnaby that the Council ratify the

action of the Board of Health, relative to their action in regard to the Pond. Seconded by J. W. Borem. Vote on Motion. Ernst no. Barnaby yes. Linwood no. Borem yes. motion lost.

Councilman W. W. Crubaugh having removed from the Corporation of Mt Union, a vacancy exists in the Board of Councilmen, and it was deemed best to fill the vacancy by appointment.

John Borem moved that Adam Little be appointed to fill the vacancy in the Board of Councilmen, seconded by J. G. Ernst. Vote. Ernst yes Barnaby yes. Linwood yes. Borem no - Lost.

Barnaby moved that H. W. Martin be appointed, seconded and vote stood. Ernst yes Barnaby yes - Linwood no Borem no. motion Lost. H. Linwood moved that

H. E. Judd be appointed, Borem seconded the motion; vote yes Linwood, Barnaby, Ernst, ~~and~~ says John Borem - motion lost. Linwood moved Borem seconded

the appointment of R. McGirr - vote Ernst no. Barnaby, Linwood yes - Borem yes. motion lost.

It was moved by Clarkson Barnaby that Montgomery Madden be appointed, seconded by J. G. Ernst, vote Ernst yes. Linwood yes. Barnaby yes. Borem yes -

The Mayor declared the motion carried and Mr Madden duly appointed, and the clerk was instructed to notify Mr Madden of his appointment. St Commissioner W. Hoiles' presented a bill as follows, viz:
