J. G. Ernst moved that a crossing be constructed at the place set forth by Mr Hartshorn. Seconded by C. Barnaby. Vote on motion - Barnaby no, Borem no, Ernst and Linwood no, Madden no. Motion lost.

There being but one member of the Council on the St Committee the Mayor nominated Mr Madden as a member there. Barnaby moved that the nomination of Mr Madden be confirmed - seconded by J. W. Borem. Motion carried all the members voting yes.

Ernst moved that the St Committee be instructed to construct a crossing across South Postage St from near the cemetery, & to use their judgement as to where it should be placed, seconded by Mr Madden. The vote on motion resulted as follows. Borem no - Linwood no - Barnaby yes, Madden yes, Ernst yes - motion lost.

The Council instructed the Committee on Street & Crossings to lower the crossing between Mrs Kirke & J. A. Armstrong, on South Postage St, & put it to the proper grade with the side walks to which it joins. C. Barnaby moved that a street crossing be constructed across Postage St from north side of J. A. Armstrong's lot to north side of J. W. Bards lot. Sec by Madden. Vote yes - Linwood, Ernst, Barnaby, Madden & Borem.

A communication was received from the Board of Health through their appointed Committee, as follows to-wit:-

Mr Union Ohio Dec 9. 1876  
To the Council of the Corporate Village of  
Mt Union:

Gentlemen: Measures will be taken soon, without resorting to the regular legal method of effectually draining and cleansing the Mill Pond in our village. This we propose to do quietly by voluntary work and subscription of money. The committee designated by the Board



The report of the Committee appointed at last meeting to confer with a Committee of the Board of Health in reference to making a ditch to drain the Pond, was given by Messrs Barnaby Ed Madden. Substantially as follows - that Elliot Johnson was willing the Pond should be drained and cleaned, so it could be done without expense to him, but desired to have it done in as short a time as practicable when once commenced, so as not to interfere with the water-privileges of the Mills. Mr Johnson is willing the Muck should be taken & removed by any person desiring to do so. Mr Antrim, E. Johnson jr & Ed Hartshorn have also been consulted & state that they propose to have the Pond properly cleaned by subscription & work, & only ask the Council to construct a ditch to the edge of the pond, by which it can be properly drained.

Mr Henry Linwood moved that the Street Committee be authorized and instructed to dig a ditch for draining said Pond, to be done at a time to suit the convenience of the Committee, of the Board of Health. motion seconded by Clarkson Barnaby, vote stood as follows to wit: - Madden yes - Barnaby yes - Borem yes - Linwood yes. - C. Barnaby moved that the action of the Council at the last meeting, by which a crossing was ordered to be placed across Portage street at the north side of Armstrongs & Bonds lots, be reconsidered - seconded by Mr Linwood, vote Ayes. Borem, Madden, Linwood & Barnaby.

C. Barnaby now moved the crossing Committee be instructed to construct a crossing, across south Portage St. from the north west corner of Mr Crubaugh's lot, directly west to the walk by the cemetery lot. - seconded by H. Linwood. vote Ayes. Madden, Barnaby, Borem & Linwood, carried. The expense to be paid from the cemetery fund.

John Borem <sup>moving</sup> that a crossing be placed across main street from the west side of Mrs E. Birketts lot to west side of R. McGivra's lot - seconded by H. Linwood, vote on motion. Barnaby yes, Madden no, Borem yes, Linwood yes - motion lost. - on motion of C. Barnaby seconded by J Borem Council adjourned. W.P. Rice - Clerk.
