

Regular Meeting of Council held May 12th 1879.

Councilmen present, E. C. Bard, J. W. Bard, H. Linwood and J. W. Boren.
Proceedings of last session read and approved.

Bills were presented from A. C. Davis & Co dated May, 1879
for Printing 200 Board of Health Notices - \$1.50
and from Melvin Guines for Lighting St Lamps from April
1st to 22nd, 15 nights @ 12c each - \$1.80

H. Linwood moved that the bills be accepted and also
issued on the Treasury for their payment from the proper
funds, seconded by John Boren - vote ayes, J. W. Bard,
E. C. Bard, H. Linwood and J. W. Boren -

A Bill for \$200 was presented by Ellis A. Johnson for rent of
Pond^{1st} to April 1st, 1879. There being no general funds in
treasury it was moved by E. C. Bard to accept the bill, seconded
by H. Linwood, vote ayes - J. W. Bard, J. Boren, E. C. Bard
and H. Linwood.

At this time Councilman McGerr took his
seat in the Council.

The Bond of Street Commissioner Judd
was presented to the Council for approval. It had been filed with
the Mayor soon after his appointment & he was sworn in by the Mayor.
The Bond was read. The Sureties were S. Gavelson and D. A. Turner.

E. C. Bard moved the Bond be accepted and approved, seconded by
R. McGerr - vote ayes, Boren, Linwood, E. C. Bard & J. W. Bard
& R. McGerr.

The Committee to investigate the matter
in relation to money appropriated by C. Barnaby reported they had
had an interview with Mrs. Jane Barnaby - she said she could
do nothing now in the way of paying it, and could not say when
she could - but would be glad to pay it if she was in condition to
do so, or was able. Linwood moved to accept the report
and discharge the Committee, see by E. C. Bard, vote ayes
McGerr, Boren, E. Bard, W. Bard, Linwood.

John Boren moved the St. Committee be authorized to
construct a sluice way across the road near Mrs. M. Bonds
and to use their discretion in regard to turning the water
down the south alley. - motion seconded by J. W. Bard
vote ayes McGerr, Linwood, Boren, E. Bard, J. W. Bard
The Finance committee presented a report or statement of the

amount of taxes they think should be levied for the year 1879 together with the distribution of the same to the various Funds.* Linwood moved to accept the report of the Committee - E. C. Bard seconded the motion - Motion prevailed. An Ordinance having been prepared the amount proposed to be levied was placed in the ordinance. And the Ordinance placed upon its first reading. The ordinance is entitled "An Ordinance to Levy Taxes for Municipal purposes, and providing for the distribution of the same" J. W. Bard moved that the rules be so suspended as to allow the Ordinance just read to pass to its second and third reading - sec by John Borem - vote ayes R. M. Gurr M. Borem, J. W. Bard, E. C. Bard and H. Linwood. The Ordinance was now read the second & third time J. W. Bard moved the Ordinance be put upon its final passage - sec by John Borem, - vote ayes Linwood, M. Gurr, Borem, E. Bard & J. W. Bard - The Mayor declared the Ordinance duly passed. John Borem moved that the Clerk be instructed to have the Ordinance published by posting copies according to law, Sec by Linwood, vote ayes M. Gurr, E. Bard, J. W. Bard, Linwood & Borem.

Borem moved the Light Committee be instructed to have the lamp post removed from Ernst's Corner & placed at the corner by Post Office. sec by E. C. Bard Ayes Bard, E. C. M. Gurr, J. Borem, J. W. Bard. Nays. H. Linwood. Motion carried.

At this time H. Linwood left the Council Chamber. J. W. Bard offered the following Resolution. vs: Whereas Ball Playing on the public streets has become a great annoyance to pedestrians and dangerous to passing vehicles. Therefore Resolved that the Clerk be and is hereby instructed to provide an ordinance & present to the Council, prohibiting the same. Motion seconded by E. C. Bard Vote on resolution, Ayes, Borem, M. Gurr, E. Bard & J. W. Bard. - R. M. Gurr made the following Motion which was seconded by E. C. Bard, vs: Resolved that the Finance Committee be instructed to prepare a schedule of rates for

License for Pedlars, with a view to an Ordinance to govern the same.
 Vote on Resolution Ayes Borem, E Bard, McGinn & W Bard
 On Motion of J W Borem sec by E C Bard Council adjourned to next
