Regular meeting of Council held at Martin's shop January 13-1880

Councilmen present Messrs C. L. Bard, J. W. Bard, John Watson, and R. M. Gov'r. Mayor H. W. Martin presiding

Proceedings of last meeting read and approved - a bill for Gasoline was read amounting to \$6.79 - which was ordered at last meeting.

Mr Watson ^{announced} the bill be approved. seconded by Mr W. Gov'r. vote on motion ayes C. L. Bard, J. W. Bard, R. M. Gov'r and J. Watson -

E. C. Bard moved the foregoing bills be accepted, seconded by J. M. Watson, vote ayes J. M. Bard - R. McGirr. J. Watson & E. C. Bard

At this time Councilman Linnwood took his seat in the Council.

J. M. Bard moved that orders be issued to pay the bills of Johnson, Grimes, Wright & Pincocks, as just read, and also an order in favor of A. B. Love for Twelve Dollars.

The motion seconded by J. Watson, and Carried. Vote Ayes E. C. Bard, McGirr, J. M. Bard & John Watson & Linnwood. The clerk had informed that the foregoing amounts was all the money there is in the Street Light fund.

R. McGirr moved that an Ordinance which had been prepared, entitled an "Ordinance Creating the Office of Street Commissioner, and providing for his election" be put upon its first reading - which was seconded by E. C. Bard, and Carried. The Ordinance was now read by the clerk, and laid over until a future meeting.

The following Petition was presented for the consideration of the Council here:

Jan 12th 1850-

Petition

To the Honorable Council of the Incorporated Village of Mount Union Stark Co Ohio. We the undersigned Citizens of the above named village do hereby respectfully request that your honorable body enact an Ordinance that will protect us against Trucksters, Peddlars and others that come into our village to set up a temporary business on certain occasions, without licence granted by the village Authorities. - Signed by 30 of the Citizens.

E. C. Bard moved to receive the Petition & place it on file sec by R. McGirr and Carried.

An Ordinance having been prepared in accordance with the wishes of the foregoing petitioners, was presented to the Council for their approval, or consideration, and was read, whereupon R. McGirr moved that the Ordinance just read, entitled an Ordinance to Licence Peddlars" be placed upon its first reading, sec by Watson and Carried. Vote ayes E. C. Bard, J. M. Bard, J. Watson, R. McGirr & Linnwood
