

Council Rooms Alliance Ohio  
Thursday eve October 4. 1877

Council convened as per adjournment  
Mayor Day presiding Roll called: Members  
present: Leek, Beardley, Gray, Coates, Jakes  
Vincent.

Minutes of last regular meeting read &  
approved.

Report of Mayor Day of Fines & Licenses  
received during Sept 1877 amounting to three or  
four Dollars of which was read & on motion of  
Vincent seconded by Gray received & ordered  
filed.

Statement of P. B. Gardner of Lumber  
Spike & Pool account was read & on  
motion of Coates seconded by Leek  
accepted & ordered filed.

Police Committee through Vincent  
reported that they had no change  
to make in their Report, <sup>on</sup> differ from their  
former Report although they had permitted  
Mr. Looman to produce further evidence.

Mr. Leek moved that Mr. Looman be  
dismissed from the Police force, motion  
seconded by Coates & the Yeas & Nays being  
called resulted as follows: Yeas: Leek, Gray,  
Coates, Jakes, Vincent 5. Nays: Beardley - 1  
Mayor Day declared Mr. Looman  
dismissed from the Police force.

Mayor Day then presented the members  
of the Council with a list of the names of  
persons desiring the position of Night Police  
when Gray moved that the present acting  
Police D. G. Hoque be continued until next  
regular meeting, motion seconded by  
Jakes and lost. Mayor Day then presented  
for nomination the name of James G. Hoque  
with the following result Yeas: Beardley, Coates,  
Jakes - 3; Nays Leek, Gray - 2. Vincent declining

to vote. The Mayor declared the nominee rejected not having a majority of votes of the members elected.

The name of Patrick Scanlan was then presented by the mayor, and the vote resulted Yes: Leek, Beardsley, Gray, Loker - 4 Nay Coates - 1. Vincent declined to vote.

The Mayor declared Mr. Scanlan elected. The following was read:
