

The Finance Committee report that in Settlement of Hay scales acct. Mr Madden had paid into the Treasury \$14.50 as follows Thirteen Dollars for rent of Scales on year + One dollar and a half for use until 1st of March 1880. They contracted to let Mr Madden keep the Scales for the coming year + pay the Corporation one half the proceeds received for weighing.

Mr R. McGirr moved that the Ordinance relating to Licencing Pedlars be taken up and placed upon its third reading. Seconded by E. C. Bard and carried vote ayes John Borem, H. Lenwood, R. McGirr, E. C. Bard, J. M. Bard and John Watson - Ordinance now read by the clerk.

Mr McGirr moved the Ordinance be placed upon its final passage - seconded by J. M. Bard - vote ayes J. M. Bard, J. M. Borem, H. Lenwood, E. C. Bard, R. McGirr, + John Watson. The Mayor declared the ordinance passed.
