Vincent moved that the Gas Committee
be instructed to correspond with parties at
various places in regard to procuring
(iron)

oil or gasoline Street Crops for such parts of town as are not now reached by Gas Mains.

Motion seconded by Conlin & carried.

Clerk read Letter from Sibley Mfg Co in regard to cost of flues for Engines. which was filed.

Monthly Report of Horse Co No 2 was read & on motion of Vincent seconded by Gray accepted & ordered filed.

The election of Levi Reichard, & A. McGowan, Martin Dougher, & George Thomas as Members of Horse Co No 2 were approved by the Council on motion of Beardsley seconded by Vincent.

On motion of Gray seconded by Lokes
passed to 1st Reading "An ordinance to
authorize the Mayor and Clerk to issue
Bonds of the Village for an amount not
to exceed \$10,000 to extend the time of
the payment of the indebtedness of the
town.

Gray moved to suspend the rules to
permit the ordinance to pass 2^d & 3^d
Reading & final passage, seconded
by Conter & carried as follows:
Yess: Beardsley, Gray, Conter, Lokes, Vincent
- 5 Nays - 0.

The ordinance then passed 2^d &
3^d Reading & the vote on the final
passage stood again as before:
Yess: Beardsley, Gray, Conter, Lokes, Vincent - 5
Nays - 0.

The Mayor declared the ordinance duly passed.

On motion of Lincoln seconded by Burdely the Clerk was instructed to publish the Village Ordinances in "The Alliance Review" if done as cheap as any where else, considering the circulation of the papers.

On motion of Gray seconded by John Bice of P.B. Garland for \$62.40 for sidewalk in front of Opera house was laid over until next meeting for further investigation.
