That We, Henry Grimes as
principal and W. C. Madden + C. Johnson
as sureties of the County of Stark and
the State of Ohio are held and firmly bound
unto the State of Ohio, in the penal sum
of Five Hundred Dollars, for which pay-
ment well and truly to be made, we
hereby jointly and severally bind ourselves
our heirs, executors and administrators
firmly by these presents.

day of April, one thousand eight hundred
and eighty one.

The condition of the above obligation
is such, that whereas the said Henry
Grimes was, on the 4th day of April A.D. 1881,
suly elected Marshal of the Incorporated
Village of Mount Union, in the County
of Stark and State of Ohio: now if
the said Henry Grimes as such Marshal
aforesaid shall faithfully perform the
duties of his said office according to
law, then the above obligation to be
void, otherwise to remain in full force
and virtue.
