

Council Chamber Oct. 22nd 1871.

Adjourned Meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor, with the following members present. H. S. Harder, J. L. Shunk, Joseph Preston, and J. G. Ernst. ~~And H. S. Harder.~~ Minutes of Regular meeting read corrected and approved. The minutes of called meeting read and approved. At this time H. P. Rice entered the Council Chamber. A vacancy having occurred in the Board of Health by the moving away of M. C. Maden. On the recommendation of the Board of Health of John Stamp. J. G. Ernst moved and J. L. Shunk seconded that John Stamp be elected to fill vacancy in the Board of Health ayes. J. L. Shunk, Joseph Preston, J. G. Ernst, H. P. Rice, H. S. Harder. Ayes. none.

John Stamp appearing at this time in the Council Chamber. He was duly qualified as member of the Board of Health by taking the oath of office. The Board of Health, presented through a committee consisting of Mr. C. N. Hartshorn the following resolution as adopted by the Board of Health for the Council consideration:

Resolved by the Board of Health for the Incorporated Village of Mount Union, that, as a sanitary measure, it is positively necessary, that the entire corporation be made one district for thorough drainage and sewerage, that as such, said corporation be properly noted and systemized by a competent Civil Engineer; that it is necessary to the health of the town that all the natural water courses or channels be promptly and fully opened and kept open; that it is also necessary to the health of the town and vicinity that there be a thorough system of underground drains and sewers of right material and size, and so constructed in each of the streets, and having branch drains leading from all cellars, ponds,

low places, wells, cisterns and buildings, as to convey freely and fully, to natural water courses or channels all stagnant or accumulating water at or about those places; and that in all ponds or low places where vegetable remains or muck have accumulated, such vegetable remains or muck shall be either removed from the corporation, or well covered with clay, so as to thoroughly neutralize and prevent the spread of any malarious gases; also, as a further sanitary necessity, gutters must be duly constructed on both sides of all the streets in the corporation, and an open drain in each ally, so as readily to convey to natural water courses or channels all storm water; and that a Civil Engineer be procured and instructed to prevent, after having made surveys, full and definite plans and specifications requisite to carrying out these provisions, also to estimate the costs of these sanitary improvements, with any other matters requisite to the proper providing by ordinance, for repaying by sale of bonds and general taxation the necessary costs of the same.

The following resolution was offered by Thos. Rice who moved its adoption seconded by J. L. Shunk.

Resolved that we approve of the action of the Board of Health, of Oct 22nd 1881. respecting the forming of the entire corporation, as one district, for drainage and sewerage as shall be necessary to the sanitary condition of the town; and that we direct said Board of Health to secure full surveys of the town and proper plans and specifications.
