Called Meeting.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor, Members of Council present, J. L. Shunk, W. S. Harler, H. P. Rice, Joseph Preston, J. G. Ernst. Absent. Henry Keller, Minutes of Adjourned Meeting read and approved.

The Board of Health presented through a committee consisting of W. C. A. Hartshorn the following resolution as adopted by the Board of Health for the Council's consideration.

Resolved by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Mount Union Ohio, that the Pond on the premises of Ellis Johnson Sr. and Mrs. Antrem within said Incorporated Village of Mt. Union, and known as the "Old Mill Pond", is, and is hereby declared to be a Public Nuisance, and is, in the opinion of said Council and Board of Health of said Incorporated Village, in a condition dangerous to life and health, on account of the large accumulations of decomposed vegetable remains, or putrid matter or muck, in and about said pond which generate unhealthy gases and give rise to malarial effluvia, productive of disease and death; and it is hereby ordered that the owners of said premises (respectively) shall cleanse and purify <sup>the same</sup> this part of the same, by rightly and thoroughly draining the water therefrom, and by either removing all of said decomposed

vegetable matter and Muck, or filling up said pond to the depth of 18 inches with hay; and that the same be commenced forthwith from the date of this service of notice of this order, and diligently prosecuted without interruption to completion; and in default of said owners, either or both, forthwith to begin and diligently proceed unto completion of his or their respective part of the same, then the Board of Health of said Incorporated Village, shall promptly commence and diligently prosecute unto completion, in a manner legally and as they shall determine, all or whatever part thereof which said owners may not have as above stated, duly completed.

On motion of J. G. Ernst seconded by Joseph Preston the action of the Board of Health was approved and the above resolution adopted as the action of the Council. Ayes, J. G. Ernst, Joseph Preston, W.
