minutes of adjourned meeting read and approved. The Board of Health through a committee consisting of C. A. Hartshorn reported the following resolution as adopted by the Board of Health, for the consideration of the Council.

Resolved by the Council of the Incorporated village of Mt. Union O. that the pond on the premises of the Alliance and Lake Erie Rail Road, within said Incorporated village and known as the "old mill pond" is, and is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, and

is, in the opinion of said Council and of the Board of Health of said Incorporated Village in a condition dangerous to life and health, on account of the large accumulations of decomposed vegetable remains or putrid matter and muck, in and about said pond, which generate unhealthy gases, and give rise to malarial effluvia, productive of disease and death; and it is hereby ordered that the owners of said premises shall cleanse and purify the same, by rightly and thoroughly filling up said pond to the depth of six inches with clay; and that the same be commenced forthwith from the date of the service of notice of this order, and diligently prosecuted without interruption to completion; and on default of said owner forthwith to begin and diligently proceed unto completion of the same, then the Board of Health of said Incorporated Village shall promptly commence and diligently prosecute unto completion, legally and in a manner as they shall determine, all or whatever part thereof, which said owner may not have, as above stated, duly completed.

On motion of Ernst J. G. seconded by H. P. Rice the above resolution passed the Council, Ayes J. G. Ernst, H. P. Rice, W. S. Hassler, Joseph Preston. Ayes none. On motion of H. P. Rice seconded by J.
