

Council Chamber, November 14<sup>th</sup> 1881.

Regular meeting.

Council called to order by the mayor, members of Council present. J. G. Ernst, H. S. Hassler, Th. P. Rice, J. L. Shunk, Joseph Preston, Henry Keller.

Minutes of called meeting read and approved.

The Board of Health through a committee consisting of H. C. Hartshorn reported the following resolution as adopted by the Board of Health for the Council's consideration.

Resolved by the Council of the incorporated village of Mt. Union O., that the pond on the premises of W<sup>m</sup>. Antrem and J. H. Bard, within said incorporated village, and known as the "old mill pond" is, and is hereby declared to be, a public nuisance, and is, in the opinion of the Council and of the Board of Health of said village, in a condition dangerous to life and health, on account of the large accumulations of decomposed vegetable remains, or putrid matter or muck, in and about said pond, which generate unhealthy gases, and give rise to malarial effluvia productive of disease and death; and it is hereby ordered that the owners of said premises shall cleanse and purify the same by draining and by either filling up said pond to the depth of 18 inches with clay or by removing to some place outside said incorporated village all of said vegetable remains; and the same be commenced forthwith from the date of the service of notice of this order, and diligently prosecuted, without interruption, to completion; and on default of said owners forthwith to begin and diligently proceed unto completion of the same, then the Board of Health of said incorporated village shall promptly commence and diligently prosecute unto completion, legally, all or whatever part thereof, which said owners may not have, as above stated, duly completed.

On motion of J. L. Shunk seconded by Joseph Preston the

above resolution passed the Council and the Clerk authorized to deliver a copy of the above resolution to the proper parties. Ayes, J. L. Shunk, Joseph Preston, W. P. Rice, J. G. Ernst, W. S. Hassler. No. Henry Keller. J. B. Strawn presented to the Council the Surveys, Plans and Specifications for the Sanitary Drainage and Sewerage of the Incorporated Village of Mt Union in one district. On motion of Joseph Preston seconded by J. G. Ernst, the following resolution passed the Council, Resolved by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Mt. Union, Ohio, that the surveys, Plans, and Specifications for the Sanitary Drainage and Sewerage of said Incorporated Village in one district, as prepared and made by Civil Engineer J. B. Strawn of Salem Co. in pursuance of and according to the resolution passed by this Council October 22<sup>d</sup> 1881 and as adopted and recommended by the Board of Health of said Incorporated Village, be hereby approved and adopted; and that said plans and specifications be placed on file, and kept on file by the Clerk of said Incorporated Village.
