

Council Chamber May 11th 1886,
 Regular meeting of Council, Mayor Scott
 in the Chair, Roll call Members of Council
 all present and answered to their names,
 Minutes of previous meeting read and on mo-
 tion of Clark seconded by M Sean were appor-
 ved, Councilman Clark called for the reading
 of the rules prepared for the government of Council
 meetings; the rules were read by the Clerk as
 follows,

- Article 1st The order of exercises shall be
 1st Roll Call
 2nd Reading of Minutes and approving the same,
 3rd Reception of Reports
 4th Reading of Bills and disposing of the same,
 5th Miscellaneous Business.
- Article 2nd Any member desiring to offer any resolution or
 make a motion, shall arise and address the
 president of the Council, who shall recognize
 the individual, who shall then proceed to offer his
 resolution or motion,
- Article 3rd All motions shall be seconded by the individual
 arising and addressing the president,
- Article 4th There shall be but one motion before the house at
 the same time, except it be a motion to
 amend or to lay on or under the table,
- Article 5th Any member desiring to speak upon any motion
 or any matter under consideration or desiring to
 introduce any business to the Council, shall a-
 rise and address the Chair and then proceed
 with his remarks,
- Article 6th Any member speaking upon any motion or other
 matter under consideration, shall confine his
 remarks to the subject under consideration, and
 not consume more than five minutes at any
 one time,
- Article 7th It shall be the duty of the Mayor to enforce
 the foregoing rules and regulations,

Clark moved that the rules just read be adopted. Seconded by ~~McLean~~ Miller. Vote Miller yes, McLean yes, Johnson yes, Clark yes, Keller yes, Grant yes, Miller reported that rippers for Marshals use could be had for \$1.50 one dollar and fifty cents. Clark moved that the committee be instructed to purchase the rippers, and an order be drawn upon the Treasurer to pay for them, seconded by Grant. Vote Miller yes, McLean yes, Johnson yes, Clark yes, Keller yes, Grant yes. Clerk J. W. Bard reported as instructed by Council at last meeting I ordered Clark and Stringers and procured a Record Book for Official Bonds and after investigation found it not necessary to get blank notices printed for side walk purposes. I have also written and delivered to Mayor Scott notices for the construction of all new side walks and all old walks repaired as ordered by Council.

Clark moved that the Clerks report be adopted seconded by Keller, Carried. Finance Committee presented the following report on the Annual Levy. For General purposes 1/2 mill for Road purposes 1/2 mill, Street Light 1/2 mill for Sanitary 1/2 mill, for Street Crossings 1/2 mill, for Sinking fund 4 Mills Total 8 mills. Keller moved that the report of the Finance committee on annual levy be adopted Miller seconded the motion, Clark moved that the motion to adopt the report of Finance Committee on levy be laid upon the table. Seconded by Keller Carried. Clark moved that lumber for Road purposes be paid out of the road fund and the lumber for Street Crossings be paid out of Street Crossing fund, Miller seconded the motion Miller yes, McLean yes, Johnson yes, Clark yes, Keller yes, Grant yes, Clark moved that the motion to adopt the finance committee report on Levy

be taken from the table, seconded by Miller. Carried, Vote on Motion to adopt the Committee's report; Miller yes, McLean yes, Johnson yes, Clark yes, Keller yes, Grant yes, Clark moved that the Mayor's report on notifying parties to construct new and repair old side walks be received and spread upon the Journal seconded by Miller and Carried, following is the report for construction of New Side walks

Clark offered the following resolution, Resolved that all existing board side walks shall on or before two years be replaced with hard brick flagstone or good paving cement unless sooner ordered on permission granted in special cases by Council; and moved that the resolution be adopted, seconded by Miller, Clark moved that the motion to adopt be laid on the table until next meeting, Carried, Clark called up the motion that was laid on the table at the last meeting, to construct a new crossing on Walnut Street, Vote ^{on the motion} to construct the new crossing resulted as follows, Miller yes, McLean No, Johnson No, Clark yes, Keller yes, Grant yes, 4 yeas 2 nays, Miller moved that the following Bill, be accepted and orders

issued on the proper funds for their payment,
 seconded by McLean, Clark moved that the
 motion be amended so as to accept all ~~except~~
 except the Street Commissioners bill, McLean
 seconded the amendment, Vote on the amend-
 ment - Miller yes, McLean yes, Johnson yes, Clark
 yes, Keller yes Grant yes, Vote on motion as a-
 mended, Miller yes, McLean yes, Johnson yes

 that the Street Committee and street commis-
 sioners be instructed to have lumber when or-
 dered delivered at the places to be used, seconded
 by Miller, carried, Clark moved that the Mayor
 be requested to report monthly and the Treas-
 urer quarterly as the law requires, seconded

A notice from the Board of Health ~~entering~~ the
town lot - put in good sanitary condition within
ten days was read, Clark moved that the Mayor
be a Committee of one to see to having the town
lot cleaned up, seconded by Miller, Carried,
Clark moved that the bill of \$2.25 for clean-
ing privies be sent to the County Auditor and
that a tax be levied against the lots where the cleaning was done,
seconded by Johnson, Carried, Clark moved
that the Street Committee be instructed to
see J. F. Oliver about having the shade trees
in front of his lot trimmed, seconded by McLean,
Carried, Clark moved that the Mayor be in-
structed to correspond with the State At-
torney with reference to students of the College
working on the road, seconded by McLean, Carried,
Clark called for the first reading of the Gen
Ordinance, which was then read by the Clerk
Clark moved that the Gen ordinance be
passed upon its first reading, seconded by
Keller, Vote Miller, McLean, Johnson,

Clark yes, Keller yes, Grant yes, Clark moved
 that the rules be suspended so as to allow the
 Ordinance providing for the annual Levy to pass its
 second & third readings and be put upon its final
 passage, seconded by Miller, Vote Grant yes, Keller
 yes, McLean yes, Miller yes, Clark yes, Johnson yes,
 The Ordinance was then read the second time,
 Clark moved that the Levy Ordinance be pas-
 sed upon its second reading, seconded by Grant,
 Vote Grant yes, Keller yes, McLean yes, Miller yes,
 Clark yes, Johnson yes, Clark then read the ordi-
 nance the third time, McLean moved that the
 Levy Ordinance be passed upon its third reading,
 seconded seconded by Clark Vote Grant yes,
 Keller yes, McLean yes, Miller yes, Clark yes, John-
 son yes, Miller moved that the Levy Ord-
 nance be placed upon its final passage, sec-
 onded by Keller Vote Grant yes, Keller yes, Mc-
 Lean yes, Miller yes, Clark yes, Johnson yes,
 Clark moved that the Clerk be instructed to
 order 1600 feet of plank 12 inches wide 13 feet
 long for street crossings, and that the Street Com-
 mittee see how much lumber was used by the
 Street Commissioner for road purposes that belong-
 ed to crossings; and report at next meeting,
 seconded by Miller, Grant yes, Keller yes, McLean yes,
 Miller yes, Clark yes, Johnson yes, Clark moved
 that the Clerk be instructed to correspond with
 Miss Woods with reference to her walk, seconded
 by Johnson, Carried, Clark moved that H.
 W. Martin be elected a member of the Board
 of Health for the term of one year unexpired term
 of Ballinger, and Robert. Norman for two years
 unexpired term of Turner, seconded by Miller,
 Carried, Joseph, Grant moved moved to
 adjourn seconded by Johnson, Carried.
