Monday Evening May 6<sup>th</sup> 1878.

Council convened in regular session Mayor Day presiding. Members present: Beardsley, Probst, Trans, Coates, Ellison, Gray, minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Bill of A. W. Helderbrand Probate Judge of Stark Co for \$54.50 cost in contesting the election between G. D. Kingsbury to the office of Marshall by D. W. Anderson was read and on motion of Gray seconded by Beardsley referred to Solicitor for information and report at the next meeting of Council.

Mayor Day then announced the judgment of the case of Shidler vs the Incorporated Village of Alliance and on motion of

Beardsley seconded by Fransue referred to Finance Committee

On motion of Coates seconded Ellison passed to 1<sup>st</sup> reading and Ordinance prohibiting stock from running at large, Beardsley moved that the rule be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and final passage seconded by Fransue and carried by the following vote: Yeas, Beardsley Probst - Fransue Coates Ellison Gray. - yeas 6 Nays - 0.

The Ordinance then passed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and the vote on its final passage stood as before Yeas - 6. Nays - 0.

The Mayor then declared the Ordinance duly passed.

On motion of Ellison seconded by Fransue passed to its first reading an Ordinance to grade and improve Alliance Street between the C and P. Rail Road and Arch Street. Moved by Gray that the rule be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and final passage seconded by Coates and carried by the following vote: Yeas, Beardsley, Fransue, Coates, Ellison, Gray. Yeas - 5. Nays - 1. The Ordinance then passed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and the vote on its final passage being the same Yeas - 5. Nays - 1.

The Mayor then declared the Ordinance duly passed.

Mayor's report was read and on motion of Beardsley seconded by Fransue accepted and ordered filed. Gas committee reported and was granted further time.

## Council Room Alliance Ohio

Monday Evening May 12<sup>th</sup> 1898.

Council convened as per adjournment.

Mayor Day presiding. Roll called members present - Beardsley Probst; Transue Coates - ~~Ellison~~, Gray.

Resolution from the Board of Health was read and on motion of Coates seconded by Ellison referred to Street-Committee.

On motion of Beardsley and seconded by Transue that the Fire Committee be instructed to make contract with J Woods to take charge of the engine for the ensuing year.

Gas committee reported as follows for lighting \$2.40 per month with the present number of posts and \$2.30 if more posts be put up.

On motion of Coates seconded by Gray report accepted.

The Fire Committee recommended that a 1000 gal cistern be put down near J Sheffers and the Civil Engineer be requested to make specifications with the Solicitor.

On motion of Coates and seconded by Probst that a new walk be ordered down on Linden Avenue commencing at North East corner of College lot and running South to Grant St with the exception of in front of Thornburgs and that the walk be repaired from Grant Street to School House.

On motion of Probst and seconded by Coates that the side walk be repaired on Mt. Union St commencing at the P &amp; O crossing and running South to the Incorporation limits.

Motion of Probst and seconded by Beardsley that a new walk be ordered down on South Side of Broadway commencing at the corner of Liberty Street and running East to Card P Rail road track.

On motion of Coates and seconded by Gray that a new side walk be ordered down on the east-side of the Baptist-church or the West-side of Freedom Street;

On motion of Beardsley and seconded by Gray that the civil Engineer be instructed to confer with the Solicitor for information concerning the improvement of Alliance Street;

Gas Committee report concerning the petition for a gas post on corner of Linden Ave and College St. recommending that the same be granted, and that the gas post be erected on the North West corner of Linden Ave and College St. On motion of Gray and seconded by Transue report accepted.

On motion of Gray and seconded by Ellison that a committee be appointed to investigate petition from Wm Jenkins asking that the south half of their farm be detached from the Incorporation. The Mayor then appointed the following Committee composed of Gray Ellison and Transue.
