Mt. Union, O. Nov. 9th 1886.

Council called to order by Mayor Scott,
Roll call, members present S. Miller,
J. H. McLean, J. Grant, D. G. Johnson and
W. A. Clark, Absent J. H. McLean and
H. Keller.

C. E. Rice, having taken the oath of office
Nov. 3^d 1886, assumed the duties of Clerk
Reading of minutes, the minutes of
the meeting of Oct. 19th read and approved.
Minutes of meeting of Nov. 1st read and
approved.

Miscellaneous business, Clark made
report on separating funds, as follows.

seconded by Grant that money borrowed be placed in the contingent fund, year, Clark, Miller, Johnson, Grant carried

Moved by Clark, seconded by Miller that orders be drawn in favor of the Sinking fund on the General, Road, Sanitary and Street Crossing funds, for the sum of Twenty Nine Dollars and Eighty four cents (\$29.84) on each, and on the Street Light fund for Ten Dollars, to replace money overdrawn, and that these sums be placed to the credit of the Contingent fund, year, Miller, Grant, Johnson and Clark, carried.

Moved by Clark, seconded by Miller that an order be drawn on Contingent fund in favor of General fund, for the amount of Seventy Eight Dollars and Twenty Two Cents, that amount being the deficit on the General fund, year Miller, Grant, Johnson, Clark, carried.

Moved by Clark, seconded by Johnson that an order be drawn on the Contingent fund in favor of H. Antrim for the sum of Eight Dollars and Eighty four Cents (\$8.84), for repairing Town well curb, year, Miller, Grant, Clark, Johnson carried.

Moved by Clark, seconded by Miller that an order be drawn on the Contingent fund in favor of J. E. Moore, for \$85.00 year, Miller, Grant, Johnson, Clark, carried.

The Mayor read proposal for lighting lamps and cleaning crossings, as follows.

"I will light the Street Lamps

and clean the crossings, furnishing
the oil, for Thirteen (13) Dollars per month.
Linus Conrad.

Moved by Clark, seconded by Johnson
That Conrad's bid be accepted, and
that he be instructed to begin work
about Nov. 25th 1886. Also that for
this purpose \$1.50 per month be
charged to the Street Crossing fund,
and \$1.50 to the Street Light fund.
Yeas. Miller, Clark, Johnson, Grant.

Moved by Clark, seconded
by Johnson that Clark be instructed
to see about purchasing new minute
book, and report at next meeting.
Yeas. Clark, Miller, Johnson, Grant.

Moved by Clark, seconded by
Miller that Dr. C. N. Hartshorn
be instructed to build sidewalk
in front of Lot No 5, in Miller's
addition, and if the lot is not
redeemed by him, that he shall
receive payment for said walk.
Yeas. Clark, Miller, Johnson, Grant.

Moved by Clark, seconded by
Miller, that Mayor and Clerk use
their discretion in giving the line
for walks on West College Street.
Yeas. Clark, Miller, Grant, Johnson.
