W. A. Clark moved the report of the Treasurer be accepted and placed on record in the minutes - Motion seconded by Mr Miller. Vote Ayes Grant, Clark, Miller, Kellar Kingsbury and Schooley, nays none.

The Mayor reported having rec^d Two dollars (\$2.00) from the Township for use of Town House for holding election, money paid to the Treasurer.

The following bills were read viz

Miller moved the bills as read, all save the one for Tickets be accepted and ordered paid from their proper funds, seconded by Henry Keller, vote Ayes Clark Grant, Keller, Miller, Kingsbury and Schooley, Mr Miller now moved that the bill for printing Borough tickets be paid from general fund, seconded by Mr Grant, vote Ayes, Keller, Miller Grant, Kingsbury and Schooley, Clark not voting.

Mr Clark moved the clerk be instructed to present a bill to the Union School Board for One dollar and fifty cents, for the service of one clerk, in holding election for School directors, on April 4th. Motion seconded by Mr Schooley, vote Ayes Clark, Grant Miller - Keller, Kingsbury and Schooley.

Joshua B. Scott, Marshal elect presented the certificate of his election, together with his Official bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) with E. N. Hartshorn and L. G. Johnson as sureties, The Mayor approved the Bond, and Mr Scott was duly qualified by the Mayor.

The Mayor made the following appointments of committees for current year, viz:

Finance - W. A. Clark and Joseph Grant.

Street & Street Crossing - S. Miller and C. P. Kingsbury

Side Walk. Jos Grant and S. Miller.

Street Light. Henry Keller and Henry B. Schooley

Mr Clark moved the nomination of committees as made by the Mayor be approved, seconded by Mr Keller - Motion carried.

Miller stated that E. C. Walton in making his bid for the construction of Dr Oak Hartshorn's Walk, done so with the understanding that

The gravel and dirt to be left on the ground for use in making & banking the sidewalk, and that Hartstorn had removed or allowed to be removed a portion of the dirt, thus necessitating extra work & cost in completing his contract, he therefore asks the Council to allow him a reasonable amt for the extra expenditure.

H. A. Clark moved that Mr Wallin be allowed by the Council to bring in a reasonable bill ^{to be added to his contract price} for whatever dirt he has to furnish in lieu of that taken away by Dr Hartstorn.

Motion seconded by Miller. Vote on motion ayes, Grant Clark, Miller, Kellan, Kingsbury and Schooley.

Mr Clark moved that the Street Light - Street Crossing and Street Committees, make an estimate of the amount of money required for the coming year for the various departments of the Borough, and hand to the Finance Committee, and that the Clerk be instructed to prepare an Ordinance for levying taxes for Municipal purposes for current year.

Motion seconded by Henry Kellan. Vote on motion. Ayes, Clark Grant, Miller, Kellan, Kingsbury and Schooley.

Mr. Clark moved the Sidewalk Committee be requested to make a tabulated statement of the condition of the Side-walks of the town, and report to next meeting, and that the Street Crossing Committee report what is needed in that department, and that they report to Council. Seconded by Miller. Vote Grant, Miller, Clark, Kellan, Kingsbury & Schooley.

Mr Clark moved that the matter of removing dirt from the east side of the Cherry property, on Nor Postage street, be left with the side walk committee, to use to best advantage in order to save expense of making a ditch or drain on east side of walk. Seconded by Kellan. Vote ayes Clark, Grant, Miller, Kellan, Kingsbury and Schooley.

At this time Councilmen Kellan retired from the Council Chamber.

It was moved by Clark & seconded by Mr Kingsbury that Miller, Grant and Mayor Scott be a committee to consider the matter of a salary for the Marshal, and report to next meeting. Vote on motion ayes, Clark, Grant, Miller, Kingsbury and Schooley nays none.

W. A. Clark moved to adjourn to meet

in two weeks from tonight. Seconded by Mr
Kingsbury, and carried

ayes Kingsbury, Clark, Grant, Schooley, Ed Miller.
Motion carried.

Clark moved that, whereas our Treasurer
Rev. James St. Turner has been removed by death and
the office, therefore vacant that the Mayor fill the
vacancy by appointment. Seconded by Mr Miller.
Motion carried.

The Mayor appointed Wm B. Cumbaugh
as Treasurer for the unexpired term of J St Turner. (that is
until the next annual election) Seconded by Grant that
Vote ayes Kingsbury, Clark, Miller Grant & Schooley
the motion confirmed.

Clark moved and Kingsbury seconded
that Council adjourn.
