

Council Chamber, Mt Union, Ohio May 10th 1887
 Council convened in regular session, called to
 order by the Mayor. Roll called. Members
 present Councilmen Clark and Kingobury,
 for absent. There not being a quorum present
 Mr Clark moved to adjourn to meet on
 Friday evening May 13th. Seconded by
 Mr Kingobury, and carried.

Regular Meeting of Council, held May 13th
 1887, Roll called, members present, Messrs. Clark
 Grant, Miller and Schooly, Mayor Scott
 presiding. - Receiving Reports being in order the
 The following was read, viz Mt Union O May 10th 1887
 Joseph L. Shunk was appointed Treasurer
 of the Village of Mt Union, Leubough not
 accepting.

Mr Clark moved that the appointment
 by the Mayor of Jos L. Shunk as Treasurer,
 to fill the unexpired term of Jas A. Turner deceased
 be confirmed. Seconded by Mr Miller.
 Vote ayes, Schooly, Miller, Grant & Clark,
 nays none. Jos L. Shunk presented
 his official Bond in the sum of One Thous-
 and dollars (\$1000.00), with Robert Norman
 and John Watson, as sureties.

Mr Clark moved the Bond and sureties be received,
 and approved. Sec by Mr Grant, and carried.
 The Mayor administered the official oath to
 Mr Shunk. Clark moved the clerk be ordered
 to give Mr Shunk a certificate to the Bank,
 stating that he has been duly appointed and qual-
 ified as successor to Jas A. Turner deceased.
 Seconded by Miller and carried.

Clark moved the clerk be instructed to cancel
 the Bond of Watson & Bard and return the same

to Watson, Sec. by Miller and carried.

Clark moved the Treasurer be permitted to keep the funds of the Corporation at whatever Bank he thinks best, or to use his own judgement in the matter, and report to the Council where the funds are deposited & kept. Sec by Miller and carried. Clark moved we so far change the order of business, as to take up the levy for the current year. Sec by Grant and carried.

Clark moved that after this year the Street Commissioner shall do the work of cleaning the streets and alleys, instead of the health officer. Sec by Miller and carried.

Clark as a member of the Finance committee read a report of the amount of money, or the percentage the committee thought should be levied for the current year, as follows viz: For General fund, one half mill ($\frac{1}{2}$) Sanitary One fourth mill ($\frac{1}{4}$) Street Crossing two and one half mills ($2\frac{1}{2}$) Road One and one fourth ($1\frac{1}{4}$) Street Light One mill (1) Marshal and Police one half mill ($\frac{1}{2}$) - Contingent one half mill ($\frac{1}{2}$) Sinking fund Three and one half mills ($3\frac{1}{2}$) Total Ten Mills (10).

Miller moved the report be adopted. Sec by Schoolley. Vote ayes, Schoolley, Miller, Grant, and Clark.

The Clerk having prepared an ordinance, entitled an "Ordinance to Levy Taxes for Municipal purposes and providing for the distribution of the same", Clark called for the reading of the Ordinance, which was then read by the clerk - Clark moved that the ordinance be passed upon its first reading. Sec by Miller.

Vote ayes, Schoolley, Miller, Grant and Clark. Ordinance was read by clerk Clark moved the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be put upon its second and third reading and final passage. Sec by Grant. Vote ayes Schoolley, Miller, Grant, Clark.

Clark moved the Ordinance pass upon its second reading. Sec by Miller. Vote ayes Schoolley, Miller, Grant & Clark. Ordinance read by the Clerk. - Mr Clark moved the Ordinance

be passed upon its third and final reading. See by Miller. Vote ayes. Schooley Miller Grant & Clark. The Clerk now read the Ordinance for the third time; The Mayor declared the Ordinance duly passed.

Clark moved that the Ordinances hereafter passed be published by the Clerk, by posting written copies at five different public places in the village. See by Miller. Vote on Motion Ayes. Schooley, Miller Grant & Clark. The following bills were read viz. Corporation of Mt Union Dr May 10th 87

Clark moved the bills as read be accepted and the Clerk instructed to issue orders for their payment from the proper funds. See by Miller, and carried. Vote ayes. Schooley, Miller Grant & Clark.

Mr Clark moved that the Sidewalk Committee ascertain whether there is a discrepancy in the grades of Arch. and Main Streets at their intersection, and that they determine what change should be made in the grades so as to make them harmonize, and that they use their judgement in the matter, and report to the Clerk what change should be made in the grade of either or both streets, and that the Clerk be instructed to prepare an Ordinance, changing the grades, or grades as the Committee shall instruct.

Motion seconded by Mr Schooley. Vote Ayes. Miller Grant, Clark and Schooley - A letter of information from The Austin Flag Stone Co. and ordered placed on file.
