

Mt Union Ohio June 16th 1887

Council convened as per adjournment in regular session. Roll called, and the following members present, viz: Henry B. Schooley, W. A. Clark, S. Miller, Jos. Grand & C. T. Kingsbury. May Scott in the chair. Mr Clark moved to defer the reading of the Minutes of the last meeting. Seconded by Mr Kingsbury, and carried. Receiving of Reports next in order. Jos L. Shunk Treasurer presented the following as the first quarterly report,

Clark moved the report read be accepted and placed on record. Seconded by Miller Ed carried. The following bills were read. June 15th 1887

Miller moved the bills be accepted and orders drawn on the respective funds for payment. seconded by Grant, Vote Ayes. Schooley, Clark, Miller, Grant & Kingsbury -

A bill of \$42.50 for constructing side walk on O W Hartshorn's property by E. C. Walter was presented, and after discussion it was by common consent allowed to lay over until another time. Miscellaneous business - The following Petition was presented and ordered read viz:

Mt Union Ohio May 25; 1887

To the Honorable Council

Incorporated Village of Mt Union Ohio.

Gentlemen:-

We the undersigned citizens of said Village, do hereby respectfully petition and urge, to at once enter into contract to pay the Town Marshal an adequate sum, say seventy-five Dollars, at least, for the services he may render in protecting life and property.

We cannot reasonably expect any service of this kind without pay, and to do without it is dangerous, and hence not economy.

E. A. Barthorn appeared before the council and presented the claims of citizens to Police protection also the matter of Stock running at large, and urged the action of the council in regard to the matter presented in the petition.

Mr Clark moved the petition be accepted and that the Committee that was appointed by the council on April 12th assure the Marshal that the Council will enter into contract to pay him Seventy five dollars per year. Seconded by Mr Kingsbury Vote Schoolley yes. Miller yes. Clark yes Kingsbury yes. Grant yes.

The Mayor reported that on south side of East main street, opposite E. C. Wallons, the bushes have grown into a thicket that should be cleared out & removed. Clark moved the Street Commissioner be instructed to clean streets and alleys, of all obstructions, and bring in a bill for the same against the owners of adjoining property, after first notifying the property owners & giving reasonable time for them to do it, seconded by Kingsbury. Vote ayes Schoolley, Miller, Clark, Kingsbury & Grant. Mayor Scott reported the grade at Henry Killers is so much as 12 inches lower than the

street is at present, & that if he pleases his walk to grade it would be so low as to allow it to be flooded from the street, unless the street is first put to grade. Council decided that he was entitled to some 6 feet or more, (10 feet in all from his property) for sidewalk purposes, & could remove enough dirt outside his walk to make sufficient drainage.

Clark moved the Street Committee be instructed to examine the street between the crossing at the centre of town and the street at Cerubaugh's, & ascertain what work is needed to put it in proper condition, and that the ditch on west side of street be kept open, and that they instruct the St. Commission not to allow the ditch filled up. Seconded by Grant. Vote Ayes, Schooly, Miller, Clark, Kingsbury and Grant. The Mayor asked the Council to pass Ordinances prohibiting the playing of Ball on the Sidewalks - Streets and alleys of the Village, and riding bicycles and velocipedes on the sidewalks of the Village.

W. A. Clark moved that the Clerk be instructed to prepare Ordinances for the same as requested by the Mayor. Seconded by Miller. Vote Ayes, Schooly, Miller, Clark, Kingsbury, Ed Grant.

Grant called attention to the unsafe condition of the bridge or crossing in the sidewalk on north side of Main St. by R. Road. Clark moved the Street Crossing Committee be instructed to put good substantial railing on each side the crossing. Sec by Miller. Vote ayes Schooly, Miller, Clark, Kingsbury & Grant. A notification was recd. in regard to the seals of Mayor & Clerk not being in conformity with law as per a late enactment of the Gen. Assembly, which required them to be of a certain size and to contain the coat of arms of the State of Ohio.

Clark moved to refer the matter of seals to the Mayor & Clerk, & that they be authorized to see to having them put in condition to fulfill the legal requirements. Sec by Miller, vote ayes, Schooly, Miller, Clark, Kingsbury and Grant. Clark moved to adjourn to Friday night the 24th inst. Sec by the majority & carried. - W. P. Rice Clerk.
