Miller moved the clerk be instructed to present the bills for sidewalks to the proper persons, and if not paid to send up as a levy against their property to the County Auditor - Seconded by Kingsbury. Vote Ayes Grant, Schooley, Miller and Kingsbury.

Miller moved that the clerk be instructed to prepare Ordinances for preventing the firing of Crackers, Torpedoes Sky rockets & other explosives, and for the prevention of disturbance of Citizens by hollowing & making noise on the streets.

Seconded by Kingsbury. Vote ayes Schooley, Grant Kingsbury and Miller.
