Miscellaneous business.

Clark moved the Mayor be appointed to see to having the well in the street at Hasslers fixed safely; that it be done by the property owner if it is right that he do it, otherwise, to do it at the towns expense - seconded by Miller and motion carried.

John Bingham appeared before the Council as agent for John Steel, and proposed settling the indebtedness for constructing sidewalk on College Street, and proposed to pay the amt of one dollar a foot for 403 feet if the Corporation would cancel the levy against the property on the treasurers books at Canton.

Clark moved the proposition of John Bingham be accepted, provided he pay Four hundred and forty four dollars and thirty cents (\$444.30) the amt the said side walk has cost the Village, and bear the cost of taking the copy of the records at Canton, (viz Treasurers book) and any additional expense, and that said payment be accepted in final settlement.

Motion seconded by S. Miller. Vote Ayes. Clark. Grant
Schoolley, Kingsbury and Miller.

Clerk moved. The Clerk
be instructed to correspond with the Auditor and ascertain
what can be done as to taking the levy off the Treasurers book and
releasing the claim against Street, and the expense of the same,
see by Kingsbury and Carried.

Clark moved that the
town well be abandoned as a public well, and that the
Corporation donate one half the cost of drilling a new
well in a place approved by the Council, and that it
shall be a free well, and that the Corporation shall not be at
the expense of keeping it in repair. Seconded by Mr Schoolley
and carried, all voting in the affirmative.
