Grant moved that an order be issued in favor of Uriah Thomas for Payment of Bond No. Principal and interest amounting to Five hundred and ~~thirty~~<sup>four</sup> dollars. (Five hundred dollars principal, and Three dollars and forty cents interest) And That Sixty one \$61.00 (\$61.00) dollars be borrowed from the Sanitary fund, and the balance paid from the sidewalk fund, \$442.41 viz: \$442.41. It was moved by Mr Keller that the Clerk be instructed to notify Joseph P. and Caroline Weir, that the limitation of time for constructing their sidewalk has long since expired, and that unless they begin by Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup> inst. and push the walk to final completion, that the Council will let the contract of completing said walk four feet in width, for the sum of Forty dollars, on a bid now on file in the Clerks office. Seconded by Miller. Vote on motion. Ayes Grant, Kingsbury, Keller and Miller.

Miller moved that C. L. Hoiles bid, now on file for completing Weir's walk, four feet in width for \$40.00 be accepted, on condition that Weir's do not comply with the instructions and requirements in the preceding motion or resolution (or notice to Weir) Seconded by Grant.
