

Mt Union Ohio April 10 - 1888.
 Members of the Council of the incorporated village of Mt Union met in regular meeting at the Town House. Members present Mayor, Geo. Scott, Councilmen W. A. Lelark, S. Miller H. B. Schooley, and L. J. Kingsbery. W. P. Rice having been elected Mayor of the village of Mt Union at the recent election, was duly qualified by Mayor Scott, and presented his official bond in the sum of one thousand (\$1000) dollars, with W. A. Lelark, John Embain, _____ as sureties which was accepted by the Mayor.

J. L. Reed, Clerk elect, was duly qualified by Mayor Rice, and presented his official Bond in the sum of Five hundred (\$500) dollars with Alfred Davis and J. S. Ernst as sureties which was accepted by the Mayor. Councilman elect W. A. Lelark, J. W. Stanley and Geo. Scott, were then duly qualified, by Mayor Rice. Jos. L. Shunk, Treasurer elect - was duly qualified by Mayor Rice and presented his official bond in the sum of one thousand (\$1000) dollars with Robt Norman and W. Soule as sureties which was accepted by the Mayor. Marshall elect, Henry Brimes was qualified by Mayor Rice and presented his official bond in the sum of one thousand (\$1000) dollars, with Henry B. Schooley and Chas. W. Pearson as sureties, which was accepted by the Mayor.

Joel B. Harris newly elected Cemetery Director was duly qualified by the Mayor. Lelarkson L. Hoiles St Commissioner elect, was duly qualified and presented his official Bond in the sum of Five hundred (\$500) dollars with E. C. Walton and H. W. Martin as surety which was accepted by the Mayor:

The Roll of the new Council was then called and responded to by the following, viz: W. A. Clark, J. W. Stanley, S. Miller, Geo. Scott, H. B. Schooley and C. F. Kingsbury

The following Bills were then read:

- \$19.83 viz: Incorporation of MT Union O. Dr to W. P. Rice for clerking and writing as per itemized Bill. Clerking Election and Judges expenses nineteen dollars and eighty three cents.
- \$15.05 To Scott & Hoppes, for 836 ft oak delivered at \$1.80 per hundred Fifteen and 57/100 dollars.
- \$12.60 To D. Conrad lighting lamps Twelve 60/100 dollars.
- \$2.34 " " " Cleaning crossings Two 34/100 "
- \$6.50 " E. H. Stanley work as Surveyor Six 50/100 "
- \$21.57 " Jos. L. Shunk services as Treasurer Twenty one dollars and fifty nine cents.

Miller moved That the Bill be accepted and ordered paid from the proper fund. motion secured by Schooley. Aclark moved to amend the motion by striking out the words "The bill be accepted and ordered paid from the proper fund," and inserting the words "The Mayor appoint a committee to compromise with Scott." amendment secured by Kingsbury. Vote on amendment. Ayes. Kingsbury, Aclark, Schooley and Stanley; Miller & Scott not voting amendment carried; vote on motion Ayes. Kingsbury Aclark, Schooley and Stanley, Scott & Miller not voting; The motion as amended having carried, The Mayor appointed Geo Scott, & W. A. Aclark as the committee.

Aclark moved that an Order be given S. Garretson for security eight dollars, Int, on a \$650. Bond, for 2 years. Secured by Schooley. Vote Ayes. Stanley, Aclark, Miller, Scott, Schooley & Kingsbury. Carried.

By motion of Aclark the sidewalk in front of the property of John Steele was unanimously accepted.

 1887, in the sum of one hundred and twenty three
 and ⁰⁶100 dollars, and Int. 6% also, to John

 in the sum of Forty Eight & ⁵⁰100 dollars, with
 Int. Providing said Bonds are written on or
Before, seconded by Schooley, vote ayes.
 Stanley, Scott, Leclark, Miller, Schooley and
 Kingsbury. motion carried;

Leclark moved that the Council fix the price
 of a days Labor for man and team at \$3. per
 day, seconded by Scott, vote ayes. Leclark:
 Miller, Stanley, Scott, Schooley & Kingsbury
 not voting the motion was lost.

Leclark moved that George Geyger be em-
 ployed to set the grade stakes from the Rail-
 road to the Public school building on main St.
 and from the North side of main St. to the
 Town House. seconded by Scott, vote ayes.
 Stanley, Leclark, Scott, Miller & Kingsbury
 motion carried

Miscellaneous Business was next in Order.

The Mayor appointed the following Committees
 for the ensuing year.

 and Kingsbury, motion carried.

Leclark moved that John Antram & Wm
 Leubaugh be ask to learn the cost of
 two ladders, suitable for protection of our
 village, and Report same to the Council.
 motion seconded by Miller, vote, ayes.

Clark, Stanley, Miller, Scott, Schooley
and Kingsbury, (carried).

Clark moved that the Mayor be elected
a committee to nominate Commissioners
to settle on terms of annexation;

seconded by Stanley; vote ayes, Clark,
Stanley, Miller, Scott, Schooley & Kingsbury
(unanimously carried).

By motion of Clark the meeting
adjourned to the call of the Mayor.
