

Wt Union. O. April 20th 1888.

Council met in Town Hall by the call of the Mayor. Meeting was called to order by the Chairman: The Roll was then called and the following persons responded to the call of their names. J. H. Stanley, W. A. Clark, S. Miller, Geo. Scott, A. B. Schooly & L. J. Kingsbury. The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was deferred.

Next in order was the report of Committee John Antram, of the committee elected at the previous meeting to learn the cost of ladders reported that a ladder 30 ft long would cost 20 cts per foot and a ladder 20 ft long 15 cts per foot. Report accepted. Clark moved that same committee be continued and ordered to purchase 1 ladder 20 ft long and 1-30 ft long. The same to be paid out of the Leaningut fund. motion seconded by Stanley, all members voting aye. the motion was carried.

Councilman Scott, Reported that J. B. Scott Ex. Marshall, would agree to no settlement except to be paid the sum of Seventy five (\$75.) dollars, for his years services, and insisted on immediate payment of the same. The report was accepted, and after considerable discussion, The Bill presented by J. B. Scott calling for Eleven ⁹³/₁₀₀ dollars (\$11³³/₁₀₀) To be paid to S. Garrison was ordered paid on motion of Kingsbury, seconded by Miller vote aye. Stanley, Miller, Scott, & Kingsbury. Miller moved that we pay the present Marshall at the rate of Seventy five (75) dollars per year for the time served, upon approval of his monthly report to the Council. motion seconded by Schooly, vote aye Stanley, Miller, Clark, Scott, Schooly and Kingsbury.

Scott then moved that the clerk be instructed to draw up an ordinance to provide for borrowing money, not to exceed the sum of one thousand (\$1000.) dollars. The same to be used for grading Streets and building Street and Alley crossings.

Clark seconded the motion, vote, aye. Stanley, Clark, Miller, Scott, Schooley and Kingsburg carried!

Clark moved that so much or more of Portage and main Streets as is ordered surveyed by special survey be put to grade second by Scott, vote aye. Stanley, Clark, Scott, Miller, Schooley and Kingsburg, ^(Carried)

Clark moved that S. Miller be instructed to ascertain the feasibility of procuring a new flange for the road scraper wheel, also authorized to procure one if thought best. second by Stanley, all voting aye. the motion was carried.

Clark moved that the clerk be instructed to prepare a Poll tax list for the Supervisor unanimously carried.

The following report was then read by the clerk.

To The Mayor and Council of the Incorporated Village of Mt Union O.

Gentlemen: In compliance with instructions by the Council of the City of Alliance O. at their regular meeting, held April 16th 1888. I hereby certify to your Honorable Body that at our regular election for City officers held April 2nd '88 the question of Annexation of The Incorporated Village of Mt Union to the City of Alliance was duly submitted to a vote of the electors of said Alliance and the result of said vote was a majority in favor of said Annexation.

By order of Council: J. M. Culbertson Clerk.

Clark moved that the report be accepted and the Mayor nominate Commissioners Secured by Stanley, vote aye, Stanley, Clark, Miller, Scott, Schooley and Kingsbury motion carried.

The Mayor then nominated O. N. Hartshorn and J. W. Craime by W. A. Clark

Clark moved that O. N. Hartshorn and J. W. Craime be elected 2 of the Commissioners motion secured by Stanley vote aye.

Clark, Stanley, Miller, Scott, Schooley & Kingsbury, (Carried)

J. W. Stanley moved that W. A. Clark be elected the 3rd Commissioner. Secured by Miller, vote aye, Stanley, Miller, Schooley, Scott & Kingsbury, (Carried.)

Scott moved that the clerk be instructed to notify the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance of the election of above ^{named} Commissioners. Secured by Kingsbury, all voting aye the motion was carried.

Clark moved that the Mayor be authorized to impose required license on all persons who peddle in the Corporation of the Village of Mt Union Ohio.

Secured by Miller, Unanimously Carried

Clark moves that the clerk be instructed to prepare an ordinance for the Annual Levy. Said ordinance to be read at the next meeting of the Council.

Secured by Miller, vote aye, Clark, Stanley, Schooley, Miller, Scott and Kingsbury,

(Carried)

By motion of Clark the meeting adjourned to the call of the Mayor.
