

Council Chamber. Mt Union O. June 4th/88.

Council met in an adjourned session by the call of the Mayor. Meeting was called to order by Mayor Rice. Roll called: and the following members responded to the call of their names.

Clark, Stanley, Scott, Miller, and Schooley.
Member absent - Kingsbury.

Reading of reports was next called for.

The Clerk read the following report from the Commissioners on Annexation:

Terms of Annexation.

Commissioners Report of Annexation To the Councils of the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, and Village of Mount Union, Stark County, Ohio:

We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by your respective bodies, for the purpose of arranging terms for the Annexation of said Village of Mount Union, to said City of Alliance, have agreed upon and hereby make our report as follows:

- 1st The incorporated Village of Mount Union shall be admitted into the City of Alliance, as a separate ward, to be known as the Mount Union Ward, and shall, in all respects, have equal rights, benefits, and privileges with any other ward of said City of Alliance; and the Council of Alliance shall provide for the same as soon as practicable.
- 2nd This annexation shall in no way affect the existing liabilities or rights of the different Corporations, but each shall pay the principal and interest on all debts contracted and liabilities incurred up to the completion of the Annexation.
- 3rd The sinking fund for the City of Alliance, shall be subdivided into three funds, one to be called the old Alliance fund, to pay all debts and interest incurred by the City of Alliance up to the completion of the Annexation; one to be called the old Mount Union fund, for the payment of all debts and interest

incurred by Mount-Union, up to the completion of the annexation; one to be called the Union fund to pay all debts contracted after the completion of the annexation. Said subfunds to be created for the first levy after the completion of the annexation, and the Alliance Council shall apportion the levy accordingly.

4th That until the next annual municipal election, said Mount-Union Ward shall be entitled to two representatives in the Alliance Council, to be selected by the Council of Mount-Union, in such manner as it may see fit.

5th All Ordinances, existing in Mount-Union, at the time of the annexation, not provided for by the Alliance ordinances, shall continue in force until repealed, amended, or otherwise properly provided for by the Alliance Council.

6th These conditions shall in no wise affect the Post-Office or School District of Mount-Union or Alliance.

McClark moved that the question of accepting the report be made order of the next regular meeting of the Council and that the Mayor nominate and the Council elect two (2) representatives to represent Mount-Union Ward in the Alliance Council after the annexation is completed." Seconded by Miller voted Aye Clark, Stanley, Miller, Scott and Schorley. Carried.

Ordinance passed

clerk read an Ordinance to amend section two (2) of an ordinance passed June 22nd / 1886, entitled An ordinance to provide for constructing street and alley crossings ⁱⁿ the Borough of Mt Union. Clerk moved the Ordinance pass on its first reading motion seconded by Scott voli Aye. Stanley Clark, Miller, Scott & Schooley. (Carried) Clerk moved that the rules be so suspended as to allow the ordinance to be put through its second and third reading and final passage. Seconded by Miller: voli Aye Stanley, Scott, Miller, Clark, & Schooley. Carried. Clerk read Ordinance second time.

Scott moved the ordinance pass upon its second reading seconded by Clark. voli Aye, Clark, Stanley, Scott, Miller, and Schooley.

Clerk read Ordinance third time.

Miller moved that the ordinance pass upon its third reading and final passage. Seconded by Stanley voli Aye. Clark, Scott, Miller, Stanley and Schooley. Carried. Mayor declared it duly passed.

Marshalls Report

The Marshalls report was then read as follows: May 18th / 1888. I have been on duty every Friday and Saturday nights since the middle of April until 11 and 12 o'clock. Except one Friday evening, and all evenings are up till 10 or 11 o'clock. I have also spent some time and taken great interest in looking after street and paid out some money in printing which I paid out of my own pocket. From May the 19th to the last of May I was on duty every night till one o'clock except Sunday nights.

Clark moved the report be accepted and an order drawn on Contingent fund for twelve & $\frac{50}{100}$ dollars. In favor of Henry Grimes. Seconded by Schooley All voting Aye. The motion carried

Clerk moved that the bills be accepted

The following bids for putting down street^{ing}
 alley crossings were then read.

Mt Union O. May 29th 1878.

To the Council of the Incorporated Village of
 Mt Union O. Gentlemen;

I herewith propose to construct six street^{ing}
 thru alley crossings at the following described place
 in the town aforesaid for the sum of Three
 hundred and fifty (350 ⁰⁰/₁₀₀) dollars. A
 crossing on College street between Andrew
 Bushmans and E. N. Hartshorn lots, a street
 crossing on Euclid street between Elizabeth

Morrrows and Mrs Davidsons lots. A crossing at Arch street between Carrie Wiers and Sophia Hoyts' properties. Three street crossings at the Public square viz: from J. S. Ernsts' and the Post office from Post office to Harlathorns street, & from Harlathorns to Mapels corner. Also an alley crossing between the Bard and Sweet property on west main St. an alley crossing from Harlathorns to Robins property on west main St. and an alley crossing on East main St between the properties of J. S. Ernsts and H. W. Martins

The street crossings to be constructed of Austin stone. The approaches, which are to be of paving stone from Austin quarries. The crossings to be 4 feet wide, on the top and laid with stone 4 feet wide, and in thickness from 4 to 5 inches in the driveway or part of the crossing liable to be used for driving over, and the ends of said crossings where not liable to be used in driving over to be of stone from 2 to 3 inches in thickness. There is to be 18 inches in width on each side of the 4 foot part that will be laid with paving stone this part is for the approaches to the crossing. The excavation under the entire crossing shall be 7 feet in width from out to out. The entire depth from top of stone on crossing to the bottom of excavation shall be 16 inches, of which some 10 inches shall be gravel.

The alley crossings to be constructed of good hard burned brick, set on edge. crossings 6 feet wide with approaches on either side 18 inches wide, laid with field stone, excavations and filling to be same (except being wider) as for street crossings as described above. The dirt from the excavations, what not needed at the crossings to be removed and put on the streets where it is needed to make fills, to be put at nearest points where needed to bring streets to grade. The street crossings at Harlathorns, Morrrows & Davidsons, and at

Arch street; shall have the 18 inches of approaches only on the part necessary for sufficient driveway and not run the entire length of crossing. The top stone to fit snug and close & finished in manner similar to the other stone crossings in Mt Union. Contract to be completed in 60 days from acceptance of bid, and setting of grade stakes by the Council. There is to be sewers under crossings viz at Hartshorn, under each end, Davidsons, under each end, P. Q. to Garretts under each end. Arch St crossing under each end. At Martin's alley a sewer under one end.

I further propose to construct a riprap drain for gutters across main street at the square. viz: from P. Q. to Ernst and from Garretts to Mapels, on the east of latter crossing and west ^{side} of former $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide from the approaches of the walk, constructed of Austin stone, laid edgewise, for the sum of fifty five dollars, or out of field stone for thirty dollars.

John J. Antram.

The bid by J. E. Moore for doing the same work was read, in which he proposed doing the aforesaid work for the sum of four hundred & forty nine dollars ($449^{\frac{00}{100}}$).

Clark moved that the bid of John J. Antram be accepted and the Clerk and Mayor be authorized to enter into contract with said J. J. Antram to have the work done according to his bid of Three hundred and fifty and fifty five dollars Total four hundred and five dollars ($405^{\frac{00}{100}}$) motion seconded by Miller. Voti. Clark yes. Scott yes, Schooley yes. Stanley yes. Miller yes. Carried.

Clark moved that the Clerk be instructed to advertise for sealed bids for putting Main street from the R. R. to the east side of Public school lot, and South Portage street from north side of the Public square to north side of Mrs. Conbaugh's
