

Mt-Union O. July 3<sup>rd</sup> 1888.

Council met in Mayor Rice's office as per adjournment. Roll called; members present:

Clark, Stanley, Scott and Kingsbury.

The reading of the minutes were deferred.

Clerk read notice received from Parker Morris concerning his sidewalk and driveway. An motion of Clark seconded by Scott action was deferred until next meeting. at this time Mr Miller came in and took his seat with the Council. Clark moved that the ordinance granting a franchise to the Alliance Street-Railway Co., to own and operate a street-Railway within the village of Mt-Union Ohio. be read, seconded by Kingsbury vote agr. Clark, Scott, Stanley Miller and Kingsbury. Carried. Said ordinance was then read. Clark moved that the ordinance pass upon its first reading seconded by Stanley vote Scott yes. Clark yes, Miller yes, Stanley yes Kingsbury yes. Carried. Clark moved that the clerk be instructed to have notice published in an Alliance paper of the Alliance Street-Railway Co, having petitioned the Council for a franchise to own and operate a street-Railway in the village of Mt-Union from the Corporation line south on Portage St to Main St also on main St east to Arch St also on Arch St north to Corporation line. motion seconded by Scott. vote Stanley yes. Clark yes. Miller yes. Scott yes. Kingsbury yes. Carried. Scott of the sidewalk committee reported the following sidewalks as O.K. <sup>and</sup> to grade. S. Miller's, Joe Nier's, Rena Conis & John Antram. An motion Clerk was instructed to give each the aforesaid persons a certificate of their sidewalk. certifying them to be O.K. Clark moved that an order be issued for ninety nine dollars and fifty cents (\$99<sup>50</sup>) in favor of The Davis Bros. for drilling

a well on public square. Seconded by Scott all voting aye the motion carried.

John Antram here asked the Council whether street crossing stone must be of the Austin stone or whether good hard stone from some other quarry would do as well, whereupon Clark moved that Mr Antram be permitted to get any such good, hard, smooth, stone that he thought would make a good crossing. Seconded by Scott carried unanimously.

Clark moved that the annexation Ordinance be read: seconded by Miller: all voted aye.

carried. Clerk then read the Ordinance:

Clark moved that the Ordinance pass on its first reading, seconded by Stanley vote aye.

Clark, Stanley, Scott, Miller & Kingsbury.

Carried. Clerk moved that the rules be so

suspended as to allow the Ordinance to be passed on its second and third reading and final passage, seconded by Miller, vote Scott yes,

Miller yes, Stanley yes, Clark yes, Kingsbury yes.

Carried. Ordinance was read second time:

Scott moved that the Ordinance pass on its second reading seconded by Stanley, vote aye.

Clark, Miller, Scott, Stanley & Kingsbury. Carried.

The Ordinance was then read the third time,

Miller moved that the Ordinance pass on its third reading and final passage, seconded by

Kingsbury vote Clark yes, Stanley yes, Scott yes

Miller yes, Kingsbury yes, carried and declared passed by the Mayor.

On motion of Stanley the Clerk was instructed to publish the Annexation Ordinance in the weekly paper of Alliance that would be published at the earliest date.

Clark moved that the Clerk be instructed to prepare all necessary papers and certificates on

annexation to be sent to the Alliance Clerk and Council.

seconded by Scott, all voting aye the

Annexation Ordinance Passed.

motion carried.
