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 Council Chamber, Mt Union O. July 10<sup>th</sup> 1888.  
 Council met in Town Hall in regular session. Called  
 to order by Mayor Rice. Roll called.  
 Members present Clark, Stanley, Scott, Miller,  
 Schooley and Kingsbury.  
 Minutes of the previous meeting were read, corrected  
 and approved as corrected.

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 Reception of reports next called for.  
 Clark reported that he considered the street grading  
 by Moore unfinished according to contract and  
 asked the permission of the Council to allow  
 the street committee to employ Captain Egger  
 Smoyer in charge, to decide the work.

Said permission was granted.

Miller reported that J. W. Scott, ex-Marshall  
 wants his pay. No action taken.

Clark moved that the street commissioner be  
 instructed to open the ditch in front of Elmer  
 Lilly's property. Seconded by Schooley. Carried  
 unanimously.

An motion of Stanley seconded by Miller. The  
 clerk was instructed to give Mrs Lipscomb a  
 certificate of her walk being according to ordinance.  
 Scott reported that the tree on E. Johnsons walk  
 and the well under S. Garrison's walk and  
 the well under Mrs Hasslers walk, are a nuisance  
 and dangerous.

Miller moved that the Council declare said  
 tree and wells a nuisance, seconded by Scott  
 Vote - Clark yes, Miller yes, Stanley yes, Schooley yes  
 Scott yes, Kingsbury yes. Carried.

An motion Clark was instructed to notify the parties  
 on whose property the aforesaid tree and wells  
 are located of the action of the Council viz:  
 declaring them a nuisance.

An motion of Stanley seconded by Scott. The  
 clerk was instructed to notify S. Garrison  
 to set his hitching post out from the sidewalk  
 between the grade stakes and the curb. also

to notify Mr Davidson to build the six feet of sidewalk necessary to complete his walk to the street crossing to be done within 30 days from date of notice.

The following bills were then read.

 \$ 2.20 To E. Ruder for work on crossing 11 hours. 20 cts per hour two  $\frac{20}{100}$  dollars.

on motion of Clark seconded by Stanley Ruder's bill was accepted at 15 cents per hour or \$1.65

Scott moved that the bills be accepted and orders drawn on their proper funds for the payment of the same. seconded by Stanley, vote aye. Clark, Stanley, Scott, Miller, Schowley, & Kingsbury.

Carried. Clark moved that the alley crossing at Martins shop be withdrawn from Antrains contract and a street crossing be built between Stamp and Horner's lots instead, <sup>at the same rate per foot</sup> seconded by Miller all voting aye the motion carried. on motion of Kingsbury seconded by Stanley the putting down of a new driveway on Parker Morris' lot was referred to the sidewalk committee.

The following resolution was then read:

Be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Mount Union Ohio. that the owners of lots No. 1, 2, 11, 12, 13, and 10 in the village of Mt Union, Ohio, be and are now hereby required and ordered,

Notified by James July 14/1885.

within 30 days after legal notice to him or 105  
his of the passage of this resolution, to construct  
a sidewalk along the side of lots aforesaid in  
the village aforesaid upon the elevation fixed by the  
ordinance now in force providing and establishing  
a grade on Main Street, in said village.  
That said sidewalk shall be six feet wide and  
constructed of stone or brick.

LeLark moved that the Resolution be adopted:  
seconded by Scott, Voti LeLark aye, Stanley aye,  
Scott aye, Miller aye, Schoolley aye, Kingsbury aye.  
Carried.

LeLark moved to reconsider the resolution by  
which we accepted Anstrains Bid for paving the  
public square. Seconded by Kingsbury, all voting  
aye the motion carried.

Miller moved that the Clerk be instructed to  
prepare an Ordinance to borrow a sum of money  
not to exceed Four hundred (\$400.) dollars, for a  
time not to exceed six years, to create a fund to  
pay the cost and expense of paving the public square.  
Seconded by Scott, Voti Clark yes, Miller yes, Scott  
yes, Stanley yes, Schoolley yes, Kingsbury yes. Carried.

On motion of LeLark Clerk was instructed  
to issue the order for The Davis Bros, for  
drilling a well on public square, on well fund.

On motion of LeLark Clerk was instructed  
to issue an order for Casselman & Fossett  
for a pump. when the Bill is presented.

An motion meeting adjourned to  
July 11<sup>th</sup> / 1885.
