Council convened in regular session.

Mayor Day presiding, Roll called. Present
Beardsley Probst - Ordway, Coates Ellison
Kray. Minutes of last meeting read and
approved.

Petition of citizens on West main Street
asking for three or four gasoline lamp posts
was read and on motion referred to gas
committee.

Mayors Report of fines and licences for the
month of July amounting to \$86.80 was read
and on motion accepted and filed

Report of W. S. Pettit - Treasurer of Cemetery
Fund was read and on motion accepted
and ordered filed. The Report read as follows

Report of J A Miller Siderwalk Commissioner was read accepted and ordered filed.

On motion of Gray seconded by Trausne passed to 1st reading an ordinance to provide for the payment of the improvement of Alliance Street.

On motion the rules were suspended to permit the ordinance to pass 2nd and 3rd reading and final passage and carried by the following vote: Yeas Beardsley, Probst, Trausne, Coates, Ellison, Gray, Yeas 6. Nays 0. - The Ordinance then passed 2nd and 3rd reading and vote on its final passage stood as before Yeas 6, Nays 0. The Mayor then declared the ordinance duly passed.

+ On motion passed to 1st reading an ordinance establishing a grade on Alliance Street on motion the rules were suspended to permit the ordinance to pass 2nd and 3rd reading and final passage, carried by the following vote: Yeas - Beardsley, Probst, Trausne, Coates, Ellison, Gray, Yeas 6, Nays 0. - The ordinance then passed 2nd and 3rd reading and vote on its final passage stood as before Yeas 6 Nays 0. The Mayor then declared the ordinance duly passed.

On motion of Gray seconded by Trausne passed to 1st reading an ordinance defining and prohibiting nuisances. Motion to suspend the rules to permit the ordinance to pass 2nd and 3rd reading carried by the following vote -

yeas, Beardsley, Probst, Transue, Coate, Ellison
 Gray, yeas 6, Nays 0. The ordinance then
 passed 2nd and 3rd reading and vote on its
 final passage stood as before, yeas 6, Nays 0.
 The Mayor then declared the ordinance
 duly passed.

 o'clock September 7, 1878, for the grading
 paving, curbing and otherwise improving
 Alliance Street between the Cleveland
 and Pittsburgh Rail way and Arch St.
 On motion of Gray seconded by Beardsley
 the Clerk was instructed to give notice in
 at least two newspapers of general circulation
 in Stark County, on or before August 10.
 That on Wednesday September 11, 1878 at
 one o'clock, P. M. at the Mayors office there
 will be sold Bonds of the Incorporated
 Village of Alliance issued for the purpose
 of defraying the expense of improving Alliance
 Street. Motion carried

On motion the gas committee was instructed to purchase twelve or more of gasoline lamp posts.

Horse Company No 2, handed in their names for resignation which was accepted. Then ~~Mr. Peffer~~ they read the names of several citizens desirous of forming a new company which on motion were accepted. Moved by Gray and seconded by Beardsley that the matter in regard to Joseph Binford's Sidewalk be referred to City Solicitor.

On motion the matter of Mr. Linders

was referred to finance Committee and City Solicitor, and the Mayor and Clerk be instructed to draw orders to the amount they agreed upon.

On motion Council adjourned to meet on Monday Evening Aug. 19. /878.

Petition of Citizens asking for a Gasoline Lamp post on the corner of Arch ~~Street~~ Summit Street and also on the South West corner of Mechanic and Summit Street.

Motion of Coates seconded by Probst that the matter be referred to gas Committee. Motion carried.

Motion of Probst seconded by Coates that the gas Committee be instructed to make contract with A. B. Love for lighting gasoline lamps. at the rate of \$1.25 per month for each lamp. Motion carried.
