Council convened as per adjournment - Mayor Day presiding. Mr. E. W. Gray having been duly qualified as Councilman by Mayor Day was present and took his seat.

Roll called present - Webb Coates Transue Gray. absent Morgan Probst. Motion of Gray seconded by Transue that

that the Street Committee be authorized to settle with J. Ogline for #62 or #65 for building stone wall and take a receipt in full for the same.

At this juncture Mr Morgan came in and took his seat.

Motion of Transue seconded by Coates that the Fire Committee be instructed to hire an Engineer and Fireman to take charge of the engine for the ensuing year.

Ordinance
 On motion passed to 1st reading an Ordinance to grade and improve that part of Freedom Street lying between the Pittsburgh Ft Wayne and Chicago Railroad and Market Street. Moved by Gray seconded by Transue that the rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass 2^d and 3^d reading and final passage carried by the following vote: yeas Morgan, Webb, Coates, Transue, Gray, yeas 5 Nays 0. The Ordinance then passed 2^d and 3^d reading and ~~voted~~ on its final passage stood as before. Mayor Day then declared the Ordinance duly passed.

An Ordinance establishing a grade on Fifth Street passed 2^d reading on motion was laid over till next regular meeting.

A communication from C. Shelton was read stating the probable cost of raising the Gaylor building near the depot to the grade of the Street on motion the communication was referred to City Solicitor.

Moved by Gray seconded by Transue that the Street Committee be instructed not to sell any more dirt until the town be supplied.

Motion of Gray seconded by Transue that the City Solicitor be instructed to prepare an Ordinance for the sinking of a culvert not to exceed 500 feet on Park Street in Freedom near the C-E-P R.R.

On motion Council adjourned.
