Council in regular session Mayor Day  
presiding Roll called present Morgan  
Probst Webb Coates Franene Gray

Minutes of last meeting read and  
approved.

Petition of citizens asking that the  
water course from Mechanic Street to  
Stalnut Street be walled up and  
covered so as to prevent the deposit of  
filth Motion of Gray seconded by Franene  
that the matter be referred to Street Com-  
mittee ~~discharge~~ at next meeting.

Petition of citizens asking for the location  
of a cistern for the use of Fire Dept and  
protection of property on North Liberty Street  
near J Beveringtons Motion of Probst seconded  
by Coates that the petition be referred to  
Fire Committee to report at next meeting.


The following was read.

I Joseph Ogline of the first part and  
the Alliance Village Corporation of the  
second part in the consideration of the  
sum of Sixty Five Dollars (\$65) do hereby  
agree to reimburse the said Incorporated  
Village of Alliance from all damages up  
to date claimed by me on account of  
washing out stone on ravine or water course  
on Lot No 4. in John Milner's addition  
caused by washing in our Village alley wall  
in the same water course, said money to be  
paid on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> of June 1879

Street Committee Incorporated Village

on motion contract was accepted and ordered recorded and placed on file.

A communication from Alliance Gas Co containing a proposal for lighting and extinguishing the Public Lamps for the ensuing year was read. Moved by Gray that the proposition be accepted recorded by Webb and carried.

The proposition of A B Love for lighting gasoline Lamps was read motion of Webb seconded by Traversé that it be referred back to Gas Committee.

Petition of citizens asking for the removal of a saloon on the corner of Patterson and Webb Street was read on motion referred to city Solicitor to report as early as possible. Motion of Gray seconded by Traversé that the Police force be relieved of ringing the town bell at five o'clock on Sunday morning. Motion carried.

Motion of Gray seconded by Traversé that the Street Committee be instructed to confer with the Rail Road authorities as to pulling down crossing in front of the Sourbeck house across the Clearland and Pittsburgh and Pittsburgh Fort Wayne and Chicago Rail Road. Motion carried.

\* Mayor Day then read the names of Richard Lee A C Silvers and B F. Mercer to make an estimate of the cost and expense of grading paving and otherwise improving that part of Freedom Street lying between the Pittsburgh Ft. Wayne and Chicago Rail road and Market Street including the Public square thereon on motion the yeas and nays were called for which resulted as follows: yeas Morgan Probst-Coates Traversé Webb Gray yeas 6 nays 0 the Mayor declared the remuneration duly confirmed.

A Contract between Joshua Woods and the Incorporated Village of Alliance was read in which J. W. Woods agreed to serve in the capacity of Engineer of the Alliance Steam fire engine for the ensuing year for the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars per year payable quarterly. Moved by Gray seconded by Morgan that the contract be accepted and filed Motion carried

A Contract between J. W. Woods and the Incorporated Village of Alliance, <sup>was read</sup> in which he agreed to act as fireman of Alliance Steam Fire engine for the sum of Two Hundred Twelve Dollars per year. On Motion contract accepted and ordered filed.

On Motion passed to 1<sup>st</sup> reading an Ordinance to Authorize the Mayor and Clerk to issue Bonds to the Amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars to extend the time of the payment of the Indebtedness of the Village.

Moved by Gray that the rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and final passage seconded by Tramm and carried by the following vote - yeas Morgan Probst Coates Tramm Webb Gray yeas 6 nays 0. The Ordinance then passed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and vote on its final passage stood as before, yeas 6 nays 0. The Mayor then declared the ordinance duly passed.

On Motion passed to 1<sup>st</sup> reading an ordinance fixing the rate of taxation and distribution of the same for the year 1879. Moved by Coates that the rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and final passage, seconded by Probst and carried by the following vote - Morgan Probst - Coates Tramm Webb Gray. The Ordinance then passed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and vote on its final passage stood as before, yeas 6 nays 0.
