Petition of citizens asking that the farm of Saml Kuffer situated in the South East corner of the Incorporated Village of Alliance be removed from the Incorporation Moved by Gray seconded by Evans that the Petition be referred to a special committee The Mayor then appointed the following committee Morgan Webb Coates

Petition of citizens asking the Council to take the necessary legal steps to secure the opening up of a 50ft street across the Cleveland and Pittsburgh Rail Road and the Pittsburgh Fort Payne and Cheay Rail Road tracks connecting the eastern terminus of Alliance Street and the South end terminus of Webb Street Motion of Gray seconded by Probst that the Petition be referred to Street Comm. He and City Solicitor

Petition of citizens arrived for the appropriation of money sufficient to erect on the Public square a stand suitable for the Band and for out door speaking. On motion of Coates seconded by Traenus the Petition was referred to Building Committee.

An Ordinance to provide the means to grade of are and improve Freedom Street between the Pittsburgh & Wayne ^{and} Chicago Rail Road and the North side of Market Street including the Public square therein was read. Moved by Gray that the rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to have 2nd and 3rd reading and final passage seconded by Coates and carried by the following vote yeas Morgan, Probst, Coates, Webb, Traenus, Gray yeas 6 nays 0.

The Ordinance then passed 2nd and 3rd reading and vote on its final passage stood as before, yeas 6 nays 0. The Mayor then declared the Ordinance duly passed.

An Ordinance to establish a grade on 2nd Street between addition passed 2nd reading on motion was laid over till next regular meeting. An Estimate of work done on Alliance during the month of July 1879 was read on motion of Coates seconded by Gray accepted and ordered filed.

On motion of Gray seconded by Traenus the Clerk was instructed to give notice in at least two newspapers of general circulation published in Alliance that on Aug 26th 1879 at 1 o'clock P.M. at the Mayor's office there would be sold Bonds of the Incorporated Village of Alliance issued for the purpose of defraying the expense of improving Freedom Street between the Pittsburg

x Port Wayne and Chicago Rail Road and the North side of Market Street including the Public square through Motion Carried

x On motion of Gray seconded by Pransie the Clerk was instructed to give notice in at least two newspapers of general circulation published in Alliance that sealed proposals would be received at the office of the Village Clerk until 12 o'clock A.M. Aug 25 for the improving of Freedom Street between the Pittsburg Port Wayne and Chicago Rail Road and the North side of Market side of Market Street including the Public square through Motion Carried

x Motion of Probst seconded by votes that new walks be ordered down on the West side of Liberty Street in front of the following Lots: Dennis Ryans property S. 114 Geo. Shavers Lot No. 1. H. B. Hubbard S. No. 2 John Beverington S. No. 3. Motion Carried

Motion of Probst seconded by Gray that new walks be ordered down on North Walnut Street in front of Daniel Peters property Lot 404 and John Francis property Lot No. 5. Motion Carried

Motion of Probst seconded by Pransie that new walks be ordered down on Columbia Street in front of Mrs. Seaman's property Lot No. 37 and S. P. Wilson's S. T. No. 19. ²⁰21 Motion Carried

x Motion of Gray seconded by Shelt that an order be drawn on the Treasury to the sum of 10²⁵ in favor of Mr. Bond to repair sidewalk tax.

Mr. Morgan called the attention of the side walk committee to the bad condition of the sidewalk on Broadway in front of E. W. Thomas property.
