Motion of Gray seconded by Transue that the matter in regard to the fence in front of Mrs Valides' property, in Freedom be referred to City Solicitor to report at next meeting. Motion carried.

Motion of Coates seconded by Transue that we adjourn to meet on Wednesday eve March 3, 1880 in order to confer with Township Trustees in regard to building a Cemetery vault and a dwelling house on Cemetery grounds. Motion carried.
