The following was read

To the Hon Mayor & Council of Alliance I do hereby report to your Hon body that at this time there no suits pending in which the Incorporated Village of Alliance is in any way interested

That the only suits against the

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Village of Alliance during the year last past, ending April 1st 1880 were,
 1st Mary W. Kirby, vs. the Incorporated Village of Alliance, which was an action to recover on account for cinders purchased for Main Street. The money for said cinder having been claimed by DeLoe & Lamborn & Co., trial held in Court of Common Pleas DeLoe & Lamborn & Co having failed to plead, judgment was rendered against the village in the sum of one hundred & eighty five Dollars, Seven Dollars cost.

2^d George Nagle against the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Suit Brought for \$2000. damages alleged to have been sustained by breaking by counter falling upon it. Was settled without trial at plaintiffs cost for Two Hundred Dollars and same being paid to Plaintiffs Council, James Ammerman.

The only monies that have come to my hands during the year ending April 1880 was 1st one hundred and twenty two Dollars and twenty five cents to pay the judgment and costs against the Incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio in the case of Mary W. Kirby against the Incorporated Village of Alliance heretofore referred to. said money was used for that purpose and Receipts taken accordingly.

2^d Received of A. H. Peck Treasurer Two Hundred Dollars to pay in full the settlement made by the village in the case of George Nagle by Jackson Nagle against the Incorporated Village of Alliance paid the same to James Ammerman Attorney for the Plaintiff and hold his receipts for the same.
